Parks & Rec Master Plan Will Allow for Residents' Input

The City of Palm Coast and Flagler County Government have partnered to develop a Parks and Recreation Master Plan for the entire community. The goal is to hear from residents, business owners, special interest groups, and any other interested parties on what they would like to see included in future planning for Flagler County.

Palm Coast City Manager Denise Bevan said, "We are thrilled to collaborate on our new Planning Our Parks initiative and we are inviting you to get involved and bring us your ideas, feedback and foresight."

An engagement website is now live to accept resident input on the parks master plan. The results will be utilized to determine the priorities for the City and County's recreational facilities and activities desired by residents, what use patterns currently are, what barriers exist to usage, identify potential partnerships, and how best to support the recreational needs of the community.


The interactive site gives residents a variety of options to interact with to let the City and County on current feedback on existing programs or activities and what they would like to see in the future. Residents can submit suggestions, feedback, and identify gaps in recreational amenities through the ideas wall.

The trail system forum is available to discuss current barriers to access and explore ways to improve the existing trail system. Users can also use the mapping tool to visualize trails within the County's boundaries and leave comments in real time. And lastly, a budgeting tool for users to prioritize where spending should be directed.

Flagler County Administrator Heidi Petito added, "As residents, you can help us navigate the direction we take as our county continues to grow and evolve, and with that growth, so does the need for new recreational amenities."

The Master Plan will look at the existing parks, recreational facilities, programs, and services, and determine the current and future level of services for the community based on public input. The plan will prioritize the needs and desires for upgrading and improv-

ing parks, recreational facilities, a m e n i t i e s, p r o g r a m s, and services. Scan to go to

Over \$47,000 has been awarded to community recipients through the years. This event is the Garden Club's major fundraising event for the students of Flagler County. The scholarship program benefits students at both high schools and continuing college students who pursue a career in agriculture, horticulture or environmental sciences.



For the younger children in Flagler County the Club offers scholarships to Wekiva Youth camp, an Art and Plant camp held at Hammock Gardens Nursery, the Junior Garden Club at several of the local elementary schools and special projects in the community creating gardens. All proceeds after expenses will be donated to the scholarship program.

Palm Coast Community Center Introduces New Support Group for Visually Impaired

The City of Palm Coast's Community Center will continue its new programming trend in 2023 with the newest addition to its roster – a support group designed specifically for the visually impaired, starting January 31.


Nearly 20 million Americans live with some form of visual impairment, and the condition continues to be of the leading causes of loss of independence among people over 65. With this in mind, the new support group aims to be not only a place of encouragement and support but also a respite from the isolation and difficulty that can often



come with living with a visual impairment.

"It can be challenging dealing with the day-today challenges that having a visual condition brings, so we are very thankful to have a place to address the goals we have for residents with visual impairment, including transportation, access to the braille library, companionship, support, and mobility training," said group co-leader Ellen Pugner. "Visual impairment affects many residents here in Palm Coast, so we are happy to offer this program where we are hopefully able to address their needs as well as a place for support from other members of the community that endure the same challenges," added Community Center Supervisor Carrie Todd.

The visually impaired support group is set to begin next Tuesday, January 31, at 11 am. Meetings will occur on the last Tuesday of every month, and new participants are free to join the group anytime. To register for the program, call the Palm Coast Community Center at (386) 986-2323



Waterfront Park to Close March 6-8 for Construction

Construction enhancements at Waterfront Park will require a temporary 3-day closure of the shell path from March 6 to March 8. The shell path will be closed at the trail entrance on Waterfront Road and at the bridge that leads to Children's Memorial Garden. During this time, there will be no alternate route to reach the trail.

This closure is required for the project to continue and is paramount for the safety of our trail users. The shell path will reopen on March 9. An electronic message board sign will be displayed regarding the closure.

During the closure, contractors will:

• Grade the retention area to the needed elevation.

 Conduct underground pipework across the path for drainage. • Add additional shell materi-

al to raise the path.

Install

sod to protect the new retention slopes.

The City of Palm Coast has received a multi-year grant through the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) to enhance Waterfront Park by building non-motorized boat access through a floating dock for a launch area. This will provide access to kayaks, paddleboards, canoes, row boats, and others, fur-

ther adding to residents' recreational experience at one of Palm Coast's treamost sured parks. Bringing

water access to Waterfront Park has been part of the park's master plan since 2005. The 20-acre park's amenities currently include:

- Family picnic pavilions.
- A playground.
- A fishing pier

 Trails connecting the City's entire trail system.

It is also home to the Children's Memorial Garden. The launch area will be available for public use on the Intracoastal Waterway for recreational activities. This project is expected to be completed in mid-August 2023.

Cathy Heighter keeps trying to help veterans, by Rachel Dolezal

In July 2003, Cathy Heighter heard a knock at the door. A knock that no military family ever wants to hear. She opened the door to the news that her 20-year-old son was killed in the line of duty in Iraq.

"I truly did not understand what it meant until I got the knock on my door. In that moment, I understood what 'Thank you for your service' meant," Heighter said.

That grim day forever changed Heighter's perspective. Not wanting pain and tragedy to define her, Heighter decided to channel her grief into helping other families through charitable work.

"It's the way I live my life. It is my passion. If I can help someone along the way, then my living is not in vain," Heighter said.

Since then, she has rallied for change in military death benefits, funded college scholarships and founded a local charity. She wants other families to "understand that we can heal."

Heighter was recently elected to Palm Coast City Council. She hopes to be a voice for the community.

She would like to see more activities for young people and more affordable housing for working-class families and senior citizens

"There's such a need to make it where people can afford to buy a home for their families and also to achieve some of that American Dream," said Heighter.

Heighter realized the need for increased death benefits for service members when her son

only received a \$10,000 death benefit and \$3,333 for funeral expenses. His funeral cost was more than \$9,000.



"They were brave enough to serve their country and lay their life on the line to serve American people. This country

owes our heroes, our troops, a debt that can never be repaid," said Heighter. "It took me having to lose my son to understand that."

With the encouragement of her congressman, she submitted a bill named The Raheen Tyson Heighter Life Insurance for America's Troops Act. She even rallied George W. Bush's support for the bill when she met him twice in 2004. Although Heighter's bill sparked the movement, the death benefit for service members was eventually increased through the Heroes' act.

Heighter's son joined the armed forces with plans to use the educational grant to pursue a future in investment banking. To honor his memory, she funded a scholarship and has

awarded thousands of dollars to graduating seniors.

In 2015, Heighter co-founded a local charity. Initially named Remembering Vets, the foundation was later changed to Remembering Heroes. The charity's mission is to support veterans, retired and active-duty armed forces members, Gold Star military families, first responders, and other local hometown heroes.

Remembering Heroes offers mentoring services and is involved with local Veteran Courts. They installed the Invisible Wounds Memorial at Heroes Memorial Park in Palm Coast in 2016. The charity also has a "Quilt of Honor" program that presents patriotic quilts to local heroes in honor of their service and sacrifice.

On Sept. 30, Remembering Heroes will hold its 3rd Annual Fall Festival at Town Center Central Park in Palm Coast. The charity will also host a Pig Roast on April 29 and a Creative Wellness Day on June 10.

Heighter hopes to soon open a health and wellness ranch for local heroes. She has purchased land in Bunnell with plans to develop it.



Beginning April 3, 2023, they are opening a new application cycle giving even more Flagler families an opportunity for home ownership.

The new application cycle begins April 3 and will remain open until May 1, 2023. Applicants may begin the process by completing a pre-screening form at www.flaglerhabitat. com.

Habitat for Humanity's mission is that "every man, woman and child should have a decent, safe and affordable place to live. We build and repair houses all over the world using volunteer labor and donations. Our partner families purchase these houses through no-profit, no-interest mortgage loans or innovative financing methods," according to their website.

The charity is able to achieve this mission through volunteer labor and monetary donations. The homes are built with the help of the homeowners-to-be and other volunteers. Once built, they are sold to families with a no-interest mortgage. In turn, the mortgage payments are then used to help build houses for other needy families.

To be considered for the program, participants must meet three criteria: need, ability to pay and sweat equity. All applicants must be residents of Flagler County and demonstrate a housing need. They must also meet the financial criteria and prove their ability to pay the monthly mortgage payments. The sweat equity requirement can be met by volunteering for the program.

Once selected, participants are able to become partner families. As a partner family, they will help in the construction of their own home as well as in the construction of homes for others. Participants are required to complete 250 hours of volunteer work which can include homeowner courses, construction help, painting, clearing lots, office work or other tasks.

Beyond helping local residents become homeowners, Flagler Habitat for Humanity also supports the children of partner families through their Prep Club. The Prep Club, which was formed in 2018, is a program that rewards children of partner families for good grades. Students receive awards each guarter for As and Bs in core classes. Can massage therapy help you?

You might think that massage therapy is a modern trend that natural healing practitioners are pushing. That's partially true. The medical benefits of massage therapy are certainly being touted these days, but it's not new. Massage therapy is part of a traditional holistic system of healing methods that began about 5,000 years ago.

The history of massage therapy dates back to 3000 BCE (or earlier) in India, where it was considered a sacred system of natural healing. Used by Hindus in Ayurveda "life health" medicine, massage therapy was a practice passed down through generations to heal injuries, relieve pain, and prevent and cure illnesses. Promoters of Ayurveda believe that illness and disease are caused when people are out of sync with the environment. Massage is believed to restore the body's natural and physical balance so that it can heal naturally.

Fast forward hundreds of years to the early 1800s when Swedish doctor/gymnast/ teacher Per Henrik Ling created a method that became known as the Swedish Movement Cure to help relieve chronic pain. As much medical gymnastics as massage therapy, it was the precursor to what we now know as Swedish massage — a style that involves stroking, pressing, squeezing and striking.

Whereas Ling's method used massage in his movements, 19th-Century Dutchman Johan

• Effleurage, which uses long, gliding strokes from the extremities inward at various levels of pressure.

• Petrissage, a technique that is rhythmic and may include

Both women practice massage but both have their individual preferences when it comes to exactly how they treat their clients based on their years of experience



kneading, skin rolling, lifting or a push-pull movement.

• Tapemotement, a beating/ tapping administered with the side of the hand, a cupped hand or fingertips used in Swedish massage.

• Friction, a technique that is physically demanding, consisting of deep, circular or crosswise movements with the thumbs, fingertips, palms or elbows, designed to penetrate deep tissue.

Fast forward again to today and you can see where massage has taken us. There are literally dozens of different massage disciplines from various cultures around the world although most have been derived from the essential basics of Swedish massage.

Here in Palm Coast there are a number of practitioners of the art of massage and we recently visited with two of them, Sophia Mascarella and Christine Brinker, who work out (they've both been involved with massage for many years) and the clients' needs.

Christine, for example, does more in the way of muscle balancing which is designed to counteract harmful muscle imbalances that result in poor body posture. With the repetitiveness of occupation and daily activities, pain occurs due to imbalances created by overuse of certain muscles and under use of others.

Sophia, on the other hand, characterizes herself as someone who works more with deep-tissue techniques. Both work with clients that have ongoing issues and Sophia also specializes in helping people recover from accidents and other physical ailments.

One thing that both stress when working with clients is the need for good communication between them and their clients. Always maintaining a comfort level for the client in *Coast* terms of how much force is used is one of the issues that is always important. And getting feedback from the client before every session helps the therapist to assess the progress that is being made in the case of a rehabilitation effort or the increase in overall well-being resulting from continuous treatments.

How do you pick a massage therapist that's right for you? After speaking with these two women in detail about how they structure their treatments for clients it became obvious that there is a factor that's important and that shouldn't overlooked and that's compatibility between the therapist and client. Some people will naturally feel more comfortable with some therapists more than others for any number of reasons. Personality may play a role as well as perhaps the physical surroundings themselves.

One important thing to remember is that without the client being completely relaxed, the treatments will probably not be as effective so this is not something to be overlooked if you are going to start massage therapy. So just finding someone you feel comfortable with is a good first step in choosing a therapist.

And after you start any treatments it should become obvious soon whether or not your program is working for you. And with both of these experienced therapists, adjustments and tweaks to your specific regimen will be made as needed as you progress over time.

They are so quick they prefer to run from approaching waves than to fly which expends more energy. They feed along shorelines but also are know for turning stones to find food.

4. Brown Pelican. While grooming Pelicans will stretch their necks to the fullest extent and also will invert their pouch to clean out any debris. Juvenile Pelicans are brown in color, their belly and head feathers turn white as they become adults. The Brown Pelican is the State Bird of Louisiana.

5. The Willet is another of our shorebirds which is also in the Sandpiper family. The eastern Willet is a year round resident of Florida and along the entire eastern shores of North America.

The Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918 banned market hunting of the Willets. Today they are listed as Least Concerned on Conservation Lists.



FACT: False. Although some seniors may have a greater need than others for the monthly proceeds or lump sum funds reverse mortgages offer, most simply prefer to be free of monthly mortgage payments. Without monthly mortgage payments, many homeowners find they can maintain their existing quality of life and build their savings to help with futureexpenses. A growing number of people who have no immediate need are taking out these loans so that they have a financial cushion for future expenses.

MYTH 5: If I outlive my life expectancy, the lender will evict me.

FACT: False. Reverse mortgage lenders put no time limit on how long borrower(s) can stay in their homes. Since homeowners still own the property, lenders cannot evict them as long as the borrower continues to live in and maintain the home, and property taxes and homeowners insurance are paid.

MYTH 6: A reverse mortgage will affect my government benefits.

FACT: A reverse mortgage generally does not affect regular Social Security or Medicare benefits. However, if you are on Medicaid, any reverse mortgage proceeds that you receive would count as an asset and could impact Medicaid eligibility. To be sure, we recommend that potential borrowers consult their federal benefits administrators or financial advisors.

MYTH 7: There are no objective advisors available to seniors trying to decide if a



reverse mortgage suits their needs.

FACT: False. Borrowers are required to work with independent, third party counselors approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in their local communities. This educational session helps them make the right decision for their unique situations.

MYTH 8: My children will be responsible for the repayment of the loan.

FACT: If the borrower or their estate wants to retain the prop-

erty, the balance must be paid in full. However, as long as the borrower or their estate sells the property to pay off the debt, there is no recourse if the HECM loan balance exceeds the home's value at maturity. Any equity remaining in the property after the reverse mortgage is retired belongs to the borrower or their estate.

MYTH 9: Reverse mortgage lenders take advantage of seniors.

FACT: Seniors who have been victims of reverse mortgage lending schemes are extreme

exceptions and typically victims of unsavory lenders. As a consumer, you should only work with reputable lenders. Protect yourself by conducting as much research as possible by consulting government agencies, your financial advisors and NRMLA, the National Reverse Mortgage Lender's Association.

MYTH 10: I've heard I won't qualify for a reverse mortgage because of my limited income. FACT: Although traditional mortgages require higher income qualifications and credit scores; the HECM also has financial requirements that must be met to ensure adequate resources to maintain property taxes, home owners insurance and HOA dues if applicable. These requirements may limit some borrowers ability to qualify, but you don't know until you try.

She is an organic gardener, pulls her own weeds, uses no chemicals, and grows food crops and concentrates on providing a suitable environment for pollinators. She enjoys growing many plants from seed, particularly her vegetables.

The front entrance has several potted succulents, bromeliads, jade, red dragon flower, ground orchid, bird's nest fern, aloe, flapjack, and lipstick plant. The center island has several bromeliads mounted on a palm tree and other bromeliads planted in the ground as well as a princess flower. The front yard contains blue and coral porter weed, several shrimp plants that she propagates and has in several gardens, along with mint for a ground cover. There are pagoda plants, lipstick plant, small potted ponytail palm, bougainvillea, bleeding heart vine, assorted baby sun rose and thornless crown of thorns.

Native plants abound with Carolina jasmine, scarlet sage, button sage, lantana, scorpion tail, creeping sage, Maypop passion vine, coral bean, salt bush, and beauty berry. Several beds have her hand made beautiful pottery planters, pottery dolls and fountains. At night she has lighted wine bottles for her edging.

Gardening Tips

Let's talk some dirt, by Master Gardener Judy Jean

The topic of this article is based on the results of a needs assessment that was conducted to determine the horticultural needs and interests of the residents of Flagler County. A needs assessment is a systematic process of gathering and analyzing information to identify gaps between current conditions and desired outcomes.

In the context of this article, the needs assessment was conducted to identify the specific topics related to gardening that Flagler County residents are interested in, as well as the level of knowledge and experience they have in gardening. The results of the needs assessment provide a foundation for creating content that is relevant and useful to the



residents of Flagler County.

es they need to make informed decisions and create positive change. This month we will be exploring soil.

Gardening is a fulfilling and rewarding hobby that can help you connect with nature and create a beautiful outdoor space. However, to have a successful garden, you need to pay close at-



tention to the soil. Soil is one of the most important components of gardening. It is where plants draw nutrients and water from, and it provides the foundation for a healthy and productive garden.

However, not all soils are equal. Some soils are more fertile than others, and some soils have a better structure for plant growth. In this article, we will explore different types of soil, how to improve soil quality in your garden, and Flagler County's soil.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF SOIL

Soil is composed of four main components: mineral material (texture), organic matter, water, and air. The mineral material, also known as the soil texture, is classified into three categories: sand, silt, and clay (See table 1 below). The organic matter is composed of decomposing plant and animal material that provides nutrients and helps to retain moisture. Water and air are also crucial components of soil, as they provide the necessary hydration and oxygen for plants to grow. These components of the soil contribute to the physical properties of soil.

Soil Texture Description

Sand Gritty texture, made up

of larger particles that allow for drainage. However, cannot hold much water or nutrients.

Silt Smoother texture than sand and is made up of smaller particles. Is able to hold more water and nutrients than sand.

Clay Dense, heavy texture that is made up of very small particles. Is able to hold a lot of water and nutrients, but it drains slowly.

IMPROVING SOIL QUALITY

The key to a healthy garden is healthy soil. If your soil is not providing your plants with th necessary nutrients and water, you can improve its quality by adding organic matter like mulch and/or compost.

Organic matter is anything that was once living and can decompose, such as compost, leaves, or grass clippings. When added to soil, organic matter can improve soil structure, increase water-holding capacity, and provide essential nutrients to plants.

Covering the soil with mulch helps to retain moisture in the soil, suppress weed growth, regulate soil temperature, and adds organic matter. To use mulch in your garden, spread a 2-3-inchdeep layer of mulch over the soil surface around your plants. Make sure there are at least 2 inches of space around the trunk of trees to prevent a mulch volcano This prevents rot.

You can create self-mulch areas in your landscape by allowing fallen leaves to stay in place. Using mulch such as melaleuca, pine straw, or eucalyptus, which are sustainably harvested, is recommended by the Florida-Friendly Landscaping[™] Program. Cypress mulch is not recommended because it may not be harvested sustainably.

Lastly considering adding compost to your landscape maintenance routine is a great way of placing nutrients back into the soil in a form that plants can easily use. Compost is a mixture of decomposed organic matter that can be used to assist soil quality. Recycling yard waste from mowing, pruning, and raking is a sustainable way of creating organic fertilizer.

FLAGLER COUNTY'S SOIL

It is no secret that Flagler County is experiencing growth. Many residents in Palm Coast are currently living in newly built homes. As a result, construction activities like land clearing, use of heavy equipment, and import of fill soils can lead to problems with plant establishment, growth, and aesthetic qualities.

According to the Soil Survey of Flagler County, Florida (U.S.D.A., Natural Resources Conservation Service, 1997) "Naturally, the soil fertility is low for most of the soils in the county. The soils generally have loose, sandy surface layers and subsurface layers that are rapidly permeable or very rapidly permeable, thus allowing the rapid leaching of fertilizer and lime following heavy rains. However, soil fertility changes as the soil is used" (pg 76).

Overall, this means to better understand your soil it is important to get it tested. At the UF/ IFAS Extension Flagler County office located at 150 Sawgrass Rd Bunnell, FL Flagler County Master Gardener Volunteers do pH testing and plant clinic for free.

Is Bob Evans The Best Restaurant In Palm Coast? Here's Why We Think So.

Since arriving in Palm Coast nearly two years ago (March, 2021) we've eaten out in at least 25-30 restaurants in the area, mostly in Palm Coast and some in Flagler Beach and Bunnell. Almost every time we've gone out it's been a disappointment. And in most cases it's been a serious disappointment, to the point where I wonder if the people running these places even have a clue.

I also wonder if I'm just too picky, especially considering my background vis a vis the food industry. I worked in restaurants at various times growing up and in young adulthood. I've published magazines for most of the last 40 years and a number of the publications I did had food-related articles in them, mostly restaurant reviews. And actually one magazine was a food magazine that covered growing vegetables and how to cook them. In Bangkok I six years.

I wrote about chefs, I interviewed Michelin-starred chefs and ate their food and I learned a



wrote about 700 restaurant reviews over a 23-year period and also published a hospitality and food service trade magazine for tremendous amount about food preparation from these people.

And then I owned a restaurant for five years and served expatriates and tourists and some local Thais a menu of traditional American food like burgers, ribs, steaks, meatloaf, fish and chips and my mother's spaghetti sauce and apple pie.

In short, I've had a bit of an education over the last 40 years or so. Am I an expert? Who knows (or cares?), but I do know how food should be served in a restaurant and when I encounter slipshod service, bad food preparation or owners who don't seem to care about their customers, or the food service business in general, I sometimes get perturbed, let's call it.

What really galls me is that most of the time the problems these places are

having are so easily correctable with either a little knowledge or a little care.

So why do I think that Bob Evans might be the best restaurant in Palm Coast? Because they are consistent and they know what they are trying to do. Does Bob Evans have the best food around? I don't know. I haven't been everywhere in this area. I will say that the portions are good sized, the prices are reasonable and the quality is consistent.

I've interviewed dozens of chefs and in some cases, as mentioned, they were very accomplished people. I used to like to ask them, "What's the most important factor in creating a successful restaurant and each one of them — each one — said "consistency."

It's true. If you put out a dish and a customer loves it then the next time that customer orders the same dish it better taste exactly the same. If it doesn't then the customer is going to be disappointed. We all know from our own experiences that this is the case.

So if you go into a Bob Evans and order any of their dishes they should have, like any restaurant, consistent quality, and in our experience so far they always have. They may not have the most innovative menu or the trendiest items on it but at least you know what you're going to get each time and that's important to diners like me. And you. And everyone else.

I actually wrote this article because a dining companion I've had for the last couple of months got upset after I criticized a couple of places that we went to recently. The first place served us prime rib tips that were pretty dry and were overcooked. I also got a martini that was brown. I never saw a brown martini before so I sent it back. They then brought me one that tasted only of cheap gin so I didn't drink it.

I paid but before leaving the

owner sort of ran into me and asked about my order. When I told him about the prime rib tips he told that they usually cooked them medium well to well done. I couldn't figure out why you would take beautiful, prime rib and cook it till it was well done and dried out. I figured he had no clue either, especially since his bartender couldn't even make a martini.

The second place was Mexican and I ordered a steak and seafood dish. The waitress asked me how I wanted the steak cooked and I told her medium rare. When she brought it to the table the steak was about a quarter of an inch thick and cooked to well done or beyond. It had the look and consistency of shoe leather. I mean, how else is a steak that thin going to end up?

And why would you even take an order for a medium rare steak when it's that thin? The people here obviously didn't have a clue either, although they make very strong margaritas. When the waitress asked me how the steak was — probably because I hadn't really touched it — I told her it was terrible. I was going to pay, and didn't ask for a discount or anything, but they decided to take it off the bill for some reason anyway.

I didn't think I was being demanding in either instance. I just wanted some decent food. I don't think it's too much to ask when I'm paying good money for what I've ordered.

So back to Bob Evans. The food is prepared well, it's reasonably priced, it's consistent and it's tasty. The service is not great but it's far from bad and considering the staffing problems all restaurants are having now I would never hold it against them.

If every restaurant here would just do what they do then the whole Palm Coast dining scene would take a big step forward.



Theater In Town

One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest and Scapino are on stage this month



Scapino is a comedic play written by the French playwright Moliere and is considered one of his most famous works. The play was first performed in 1671 and has since been performed countless times, both in France and internationally. One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest is a play written by Dale Wasserman, based on the 1962 novel by Ken Kesey. The play was first performed in 1963 and has since become one of the most enduring and powerful works of American theater.

The play takes place in a mental institution in Oregon in the 1950s and focuses on the character of Randle Patrick McMurphy, a boisterous and rebellious patient who challenges the oppressive authority of the head nurse, Mildred Ratched. McMurphy's arrival at the institution shakes up the status quo and sparks a power struggle between him and Ratched that ultimately leads to a tragic and profound exploration of the nature of power, freedom, and the human spirit.

One of the key themes of the play is the idea of individual freedom versus institutional control. Through the character of McMurphy, the play challenges the notion that mental institutions are necessary or beneficial to society, and instead argues that these institutions serve to undermine the individuality and autonomy of those who are deemed "mentally ill." 

Flagler Artists

"Selfish" painter creates beach landscapes, by James Moore

Growing up on a dairy farm in Delaware, one of seven children, Berdella "Birdie" Gibb's family had the necessities, but only just. One special thing

her parents got was a subscription to National Geographic. The family gathered around every month, "better than the Christmas catalogue," she said. Wonderful images of landscapes, sea-

scapes, and photographs of beautiful animals. What stood out to her were the birds.

As an adult, Birdie married a military man. His Air Force career took them all over. Moving so much might exhaust some, but Birdie found an opportunity. In 1978, her husband had enrolled her in a photography class at a local college. Years after that first issue of National Geographic, photographs still moved her. She took travel photos wherever she went.

From the early 1970s to the

early 1990s, Birdie was a critical care nurse. This provided her a career flexible to the constant moving. Her travels continued after she retired and

founded her own business for clinical research. This, too, needed to be put on hold so she could care for her mother.

"I re-invented myself six years ago,"

Birdie said. Many instructional YouTube videos, Zoom calls, and conferences taught her how to develop a critical eye for photographs, analyzing what she liked and disliked in her work. She joined local photography clubs and has been an active member for several years. She provides the same starting tips and advice for newcomers that helped her flourish.

"Take pictures of what it is you love, and that love will show through," was such advice she continues to hold today.

It is because of this philosophy that Birdie does not take commissions. Photography is her hobby, something she does for fun, to unwind, and to reboot. "I would not call myself a photographer," she said. Only selling pieces to pay for her art, new lenses, or an updated computer program.

These pieces are often large ones, designed to take up a wall in your home. Relax and admire the subject like a Blue Heron and intricacies of its feathers and habitat or stun with the beauty of the beach at sunset.

She prefers photographing nature and birds, instead of people. This beauty is better found in a moment captured, rather than staged. Because of this passion, Birdie studies the birds she loves, such as the Great Egret, Blue Heron, Rosy Egg Spoonbill, and the Big White Pelican. Hours spent learning each bird's habits and maneuvering around them, waiting for the subject to wake up, take flight, or hunt to capture a perfect moment. "It takes a lot of patience and learning," she said. "But when you enjoy watching the bird, that is not a hardship. I love those big, beautiful birds and their gorgeous feathers."



Birdie does not take all her photos with bigger Nikon brand cameras like the D7 or D90. She also has her smartphone. Walking on the beach, she will ease towards the tiny sandpipers, chasing after the surf with their quick, tiny legs, and squat down to their level to capture that perfect moment and post to social media.

"What is important to me is preserving the environment," she said. "For the birds and for our grandchildren. When you get out there in nature, and you see it, it is pristine, but houses crop in.

Their habitats are going to be gone. We need to preserve areas for them and be careful how we treat the Earth. It is special."

And this is what Birdie has achieved at her most recent exhibit, "Birds and Beaches" at the Pineapple Gallery in Flagler Beach.






