



3rd Year Coming Up For Heroes Event

When her youngest son was killed serving in Iraq on July 24, 2003, Cathy Heighter's world was turned upside down. His death also set her on a new course she would never have imagined possible.

She quickly became one of the nation's most active and most effective advocates for veterans — including meeting twice with President George W. Bush to lobby for changes to what she said she couldn't believe were the "shockingly low" death benefit the families of military members killed on active duty received.

"Something had to be done about this," Heighter said. "There is no reason our children should be going over to a foreign country to fight to protect our nation and make the ultimate sacrifice laying down their lives for their families to find out their life was only worth \$10,000."

Today, her efforts are focused on helping veterans in Palm Coast and Flagler/Volusia counties get connected with resources and support in her role as co-founder and executive director of the Palm Coast based Remembering Vets.

On Saturday, September 30, the community is invited to a full day of honoring and remembering heroes of all types at a Remembering Heroes sponsored event at the Palm Coast Town Center at 800 Belle Terre Parkway. The event is scheduled for 10 AM To 3 PM.

"We are going to be honoring veterans and first responders and Gold Star families (families who have a member that died

on active duty)," Heighter said. But this year, the annual event is expanding. "We are also honoring local com-

munity heroes that stepped up to the plate and above and beyond and way out of their way during this COVID-19 pandemic. From food service industry workers and health care workers, we want to honor them and make sure they know how valued they are."

Quilts of honor are slated

to be presented to various heroes, she said.

The event features a plethora of food trucks, the presence of fire and police personnel and equipment and a game area organized for kids are all planned.

Yes, her efforts were initially inspired by the shocking death of her son. He remains a key motivating factor. But for Heighter, her work supporting veterans and their families goes well beyond merely a personal quest.

"This has given my son's life and death more meaning," Heighter said. "But what I want the community to understand is that we should never forget



the sacrifices that these brave young men and women have made for our freedoms and we need to honor and understand that we owe them a debt we can never repay."

Green Expo Coming to Flagler County in September

In an effort to foster environmental consciousness and sustainable practices, UF/IFAS Extension is excited to announce the collaboration of the St. Johns River Water Management District, Flagler County Professionals, City of Palm Coast, and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for the inaugural Green Expo. The complimentary event is scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 14, at the Flagler County Fairgrounds Cattleman's Hall at 150 Sawgrass Road in Bunnell.

"The Green Expo aims to

bridge the gap between knowledge and action, equipping individuals with the tools they need to make positive changes in their lives and communities," said Judy Jean, Horticulture Extension Agent at UF/IFAS Extension Flagler County. "Our collaborative effort brings together experts and stakeholders from various sectors to provide a policy-neutral and fact-based platform for learning and networking."

The Green Expo will feature a series of educational sessions and panel discussions, each led by experts and thought leaders in the field of sustainability. It will bring together community leaders, homeowners, professionals and eco-enthusiasts to delve into crucial topics of sustainability and environmental



responsibility.

Participants will have the opportunity to engage in dynamic conversations covering topics including water conservation and quality, energy efficiency, sustainable gardening practices and the significance of making ecologically conscious choices in our day-to-day lives. With a focus on science-based

information, attendees will gain insights into both current and future environmental challenges within Flagler County and neighboring areas.

"The event is open to a diverse audience, including Flagler County residents, homeowner association board members and managers, green industry professionals and community leaders," added Jean.

Latest FBI Pedophilia Raid Has Meaning For Mayor Alfin

Palm Coast Mayor David Alfin isn't a fan of the concept of closure. "I think closure is a false narrative," he said, now two and a half years out from the murder of his son, FBI agent Daniel Alfin, as he was serving a warrant in Sunrise, Florida.

"Closure is an excuse to try to describe an emotion." Still, everything was changed when the agency informed him that almost a hundred suspects were arrested in the investigation that Daniel had died participating in.

Indeed, the news that the FBI had arrested 98 people in connection to a pedophilia ring on August 9 in the United States and Australia brought a new perspective to Alfin on his son's killing. But where thinking in terms of closure may cause one to try and store away the feelings and hardships that come with a loss for good, Alfin sees it as more pertinent to recognize the positives of


the arrests.

Not only were 13 children rescued in Australia, but the scope of the operation will serve to promote public awareness of the prevalence of human trafficking and the efforts of law enforcement organizations to thwart it. And with awareness can come additional resources.

"These things don't come free," Alfin pointed out to that end. "If the agency has the funding for this program, that will yield more and more arrests." Potential funding boosts would come at at a time when public support for defunding the FBI in part or entirely is growing rapidly; ex-President Donald Trump has advocated for such measures, as have representatives Marjorie Taylor Greene (R, GA) and Matt Gaetz (R-FL).

"I am encouraged and delighted to know that their work yielded this result, which is not just a significant arrest but it's the tak-

ing down of a cartel," Alfin continued. "More than that, it's bringing the issues of child pornography and human trafficking to the attention of the public. The public is somewhat blinded to the fact this



goes on, it's so ugly that people can't really go there."

Data from the United States Bureau of Justice shows that prosecution of human trafficking suspects is on the rise. 729 individuals were prosecuted in 2011, compared to 1,343 in 2020. The National Human Trafficking Hotline has identified 82,301 cases of human trafficking since its inception in 2007, with an average of two victims per case.

"I believe that if there is more awareness this is going on, there's a better chance that our folks like the FBI and all the other agencies, police, and first responders can arrest those people and dole out the punishments that they deserve," Alfin said.

FBI agents Daniel Alfin and Laura Schwartzenberger were killed in Sunrise, Florida on February 2nd, 2021. Three others were injured in the shooting. The suspected killer committed suicide shortly after, and so while David Alfin won't see his son's killers brought to legal justice, he is now afforded the chance to view the issue in its broader effects, and not just those lingering loose ends from the investigation that took Daniel's life. — *Chris Gollon*

Local Author Publishes New Book On Disasters

Are we doomed? As individuals, certainly, eventually, inevitably. But as a species? As a civilization? Leading catastrophe engineer Michel Bruneau thinks perhaps not.

Michel Bruneau is a SUNY Distinguished Professor at the University at Buffalo, a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Engineers and of the American Society of Civil Engineers, and, most significantly, Emeritus Director of a National Science Foundation's national engineering research center focused on preventing disasters from extreme events. And he happens to be a part-time resident of Palm Coast who submitted this information about his loatest book in the hopes that we would write about it, which we obviously have.


The Blessings of Disaster draws on knowledge from multiple disciplines to illustrate how our civilization's future successes and failures in dealing with societal threats—be they pandemics, climate change, overpopulation, monetary collapse, and nuclear holocaust—can be predicted by observing how we currently cope with and react to natural and technological disasters.

Maybe most importantly, this entertaining and often counter-intuitive book shows how we can think in better ways about disasters, to strengthen and extend our existence as both individuals and as a species.

When it comes to rare extreme events, such as earthquakes, hurricanes, floods, tornados, volcanic eruptions,

technological accidents, terrorist attacks, pandemics, and even existential threats, it is in our nature to set ourselves up for disasters because the gamble may be worth it. But only maybe.

The Blessings of Disaster is the very real story of the relationship between humans and disasters - and it's not a simple one. Bringing together his decades-long career spanning the globe as an earthquake and disaster engineer, detailed catastrophe case studies from extreme events like Japan's Kobe earthquake and category 5 hurricanes in the American South, along with thoughtful and practical solutions, Bruneau provides a thorough examination of the structural challenges that face today's and tomorrow's world.



How we cope with today's threats is indicative of what the future holds. Contrary to popular forecasts, it is not all gloom and doom, but some of it definitely is.

He has worked for more than three decades as part of multidisciplinary teams advancing the goal of disaster resilience and has received more than 20 prestigious awards for this innovative work, including a lifetime achievement award.

It's a sometimes fascinating read and is always compelling as Bruneau relates disasters and their effects on our everyday lives with some being good and others, unfortunately, not.



A lifetime in radio brought David Ayres to Palm Coast, by James Moore

The lifelong broadcasting journey of David Ayres started when he was a child in Cleveland. Day and night, he listened to the stations on his little clock radio. Every show offered something else.

Yes, there was music, but there was also community there. Each DJ was raising awareness of festivals, shows, charities and local businesses. This aspect of the trade would stick with David until today.

Starting at his high school's TV department and continuing to intern at some of those same stations, David gradually absorbed the tools of the trade. After graduating from the University of South Florida, David worked in radio stations across Florida. Tampa, Port Charlotte, Punta Gorda,

as well as Jacksonville, before he and his wife came to Palm Coast

At that point, he had worked under a corporate station

named Clear Channel but has since rebranded into iHeart. An old coworker of his named Jim Martin had invited him to help run a radio station. Never having heard of Palm Coast, David agreed.

"What a cool little town," was David's first impression. It was 2008 and there were no stations or towers. David and Jim started WNZF with an AM station. Eventually, they gained an FM translator, and another FM station. It was 2009 then, and the channel was FM 92.7. It was a channel meant for cheerful music. No news, besides weather and local infor-

mation. The success of this bought them another station, FM 98.7, where they play country music, and FM 100.9 as their oldies station.

Two things seem to be the





key to David's success. The first thing is the stations' programming.

"We don't program for ratings, we program for time spent listening," David says. Ultimately, he wants it so a listener can have the station on all day and not hear the same song twice. The second, and arguably the more important, thing is community engagement.

All those stations David grew up on in Cleveland had events for people to come together and enjoy what the area offered. Why not here in Flagler County as well? Especially after Palm Coast had been so good for him and his family. "We came in at the right time. We were embraced by the community," he says. As a result, David wants WNZF to be a voice for the businesses and the local clubs and organizations, for anybody and evervbody.

Working with local talent to

host events such as Creekside music, arts, and food festival, and the Sunset Concert and the proceeds going to charity. The Sea Turtle Hospital, Humane Society, and Grace Community Food Pantry all received support and donations from David and his stations.

What comes next for David and WNZF is the same challenge any content creation runs into: staying relevant. Growth is necessary for both the individual and the collective. Tune into any of these stations and you will hear David interviewing local business owners, charity runners, etc.

Maintaining bonds with the community offers more opportunities to give back to the town that has been a home for David and his family.

"This is a great town, and we have an obligation to keep it that way. It's fun when you can wake up in the morning and be happy. It does not get much better than that."

Kids Rock The Nation Brings Music To Kids

In March 2022, Congress raised a flag in honor of the organization, Kids Rock the Nation. Certified as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in 2014, Kids Rock the Nation has successfully donated approximately 1,500 instruments to children and schools, including guitars, drums, violins, and more. And what started this program was an act of kindness.

Founder Anthony Kleppe, aka Anthony Wild, has been active in the music community since he was a child in Wisconsin. Moving to Florida in 1994, he performed in clubs, festivals, and concerts as a blues musician. Eighteen years ago, Anthony was diagnosed with cancer. As much as he loves being a musician, there was no medical insurance to help him combat his illness.

Be it a stroke of luck, or something more merciful, a doctor

agreed to treat Anthony. Feeling free and wanting to give back for this miracle, the doctor asked Anthony to do one thing: give back with music.

The first act was gifting a guitar to the daughter of Vinny the Printer, here in Palm Coast. Anthony continued this act of gifting instruments and music lessons to all who needed them. Eventually he accumulated a team and the 501(c)(3) nonprofit rating.

Kids Rock the Nation started in Central Florida, continuing to gift instruments. Children who have cancer, those who experienced abuse and neglect, as well as children on the autism spectrum all benefited from this group. Before long, they were reaching out to schools to facilitate music programs and classes.


The organization grew further, reaching out to the rest of the nation and beyond. Towns in Canada, the Caribbean, Guatemala, and as far as the Philippines have hosted Kids Rock the Nation programs. And the list of supporters is growing. Local businesses in Daytona have given support. So have the Grammy Awards and other musicians like George Thorogood and his Bo Diddly Foundation.

"I think God put me on a path," Anthony says. Because of the kindness he received at the lowest point of his life, Anthony is not slowing down in giving back. The next phase for Kids Rock the Nation is a central location somewhere in Central Florida. With this first location, children can attend classes. These courses will focus on both playing instruments and comprehension in the business aspect of the music industry. All of this will be free.

A Short History of Flagler County High Schools

Flagler County was established in 1917 as was Bunnell High School. It was an all-white school. Blacks were forbidden to attend. It would not be until 1949 when George Washington Carver High School was built that a K-12 education was available to the black community. Of course, Carver was an all-black school.

Whites did not want to attend. Flagler County history in education is not unlike many counties and states across our country. It does have an interesting story of how black kids and white kids finally attended the same forever high school.

It was 1954 when the Brown

in public schools are unconstitutional, even if the segregated schools are otherwise equal in quality. In 1967, 13 years later, George Washington Carver was closed and all students, black and white, attended Bunnell High School.

For two years, 1968-1970, students arrived at Bunnell High School until the summer it burned down. 

- The Espanola Schoolhouse 1950-1957 was a segregated black-only Flagler County public school during the Jim Crow era. It later operated as an independent school. It still

Working out is easier than you think, by John Williams

Last year I wrote a column about losing weight and why it isn't inevitable as we age. In this month's column I'm going to talk about exercising, the most important thing to do along with your efforts to cut down on your food intake.

First, as I mentioned last month, the more calories you consume, the more you need to burn off to avoid having all those calories turned into fat by your body. If you lead a really active lifestyle and don't eat too much then you're probably already near your target weight. But most people don't do both, especially as they get older, so we need to exercise to get rid of those extra calories.

I've worked out for 45 years in gyms and also spent a lot of time running on tracks and outside. Now, at age 66, I'm concentrating on keeping my muscles toned and keeping my body in a generally healthy state. What that means is that I'm not trying to build a lot of muscle. I'm just trying to maintain what I have and keep my respiratory system (heart, lungs) in good shape.

What I do is simple and doesn't take much time — a little less than an hour — and it keeps me in great shape. Basically I do some aerobic exercise every day along with abs and then I rotate the weight work so that I work on a different muscle group every day.

So on my first day I'll work on biceps as well as doing my aerobic exercise and abs. I use an elliptical trainer for the aerobics and do 30 minutes on that. The weight lifting portion of my workout takes about 20 minutes. Part of that is three sets of leg lifts for abs with 30 reps in each set.

Then I do three sets of three different exercises that focus on

my biceps. That's it. It's about 50 minutes and it's all I need to keep myself in great shape. Of course, I'm in the gym six days a week but I find that easy to do even though I work full time.

Having to work makes things a little more difficult in terms of time but I'm self-employed and can come and go as I please so I usually work out around noon

when most other people are eating lunch so I don't lose as much productive time during the day. Obviously, if you're retired you don't have to worry about time as much, if at all.

So the rest of the workouts are the same as you rotate the weight exercises through the days. So the next day I do chest, then back, then shoulders and then legs. One day I just do aerobics and


I take a day off every five days. So I work out five days with weights and doing aerobics, I do one day of just aerobics and I have one day off which makes seven days.

So every week I work on each muscle group once, I do aerobics six days and I have one day off. Taking a day off every fifth day means I'm in the gym about 25 days a month or six days a week

If this is too much for you then you can cut back in two ways. You can do less each workout or just do fewer workouts. If it were me I would cut down the workload and keep the number of workouts. Here's why. When you work out and get your heart rate up to a certain level then you've hiked up your metabolic

rate also.

We want to do this because the higher our metabolism, the more calories we burn. When we work out our metabolism stays at an elevated level for about 24 hours. So if you work out every 24 hours then you'll keep your metabolism at a higher level than normal and you'll burn more calories. If you cut



down the number of workouts you won't be keeping your metabolism elevated as much.

So now you have an easy routine to follow. And it is easy since you control how much effort you need to put in by how much weight you put on the machines you use or the freeweight bars or dumbbells you're using.

Many of you may have never been in a gym before. You might look in and see all kinds of funny looking machines and not have a clue about what to do. That's okay. It's the same for everyone at first. Don't worry. Just ask the people who run whatever gym you go into that you need some help. Tell them that you want three different things to do to exercise your biceps, for exam-

ple and they'll show you. Same with any of the muscle groups.

And they'll show you how to use any of the machines including the aerobics machines. Believe me, they want you to become a regular member and you're only going to do that if you feel comfortable with what you're doing. And if they're not helpful for any reason then find a new gym.

That's a good reason why you should try out any kind of trial membership they offer. Your first pick for a gym might not work out and you don't want to be obligated to a long-term membership.

It's going to feel strange when you first start no matter where you are so be ready for that. Also be ready to be sore if you haven't been working out for a while or if it's your first time ever. Don't worry about it. Your muscles are going to hurt at first because you're not used to it.

Just be sure to not use too much weight. You're not trying to compete with Arnold. You're just there to get in shape so don't push yourself. If something feels too heavy then lower the weight you're using. And if I don't feel good on a particular day for whatever reason then I just don't go to the gym. There's no reason to push yourself unnecessarily. The last thing you want to do is strain something or hurt something which will then mess up your workout schedule.






US Navy Band Commodores Jazz Ensemble November 3


ful touring act in America's Got Talent history according to their tremendous live ticket sales, which Pollstar tracks with over 1400 live performances.





Flagler Artists

The stained glass art of Dr. Lee Richards, by James Moore



Walking into the home of Lee Richards, Ph.D., one is awash with a rainbow of light. A scarlet macaw about to take flight off a jungle branch. A pod of dolphins out-swimming an oncoming wave. A pair of manatees serenely floating towards a turtle on the ocean floor. A bright blue peacock surrounded by pink flowers, to name a few original pieces that adorn Dr. Richards's home. And every one of them has received an award.

Approximately forty years ago, Dr. Richards attended his first stained glass class, after being told he needed a hobby. During that first class, he discovered he had a proclivity for it. "Stained glass is the perfect art medium because it blends creativity and artistic ability with engineering," he says. The second project he ever did was a floral lamp he keeps in his living room.

At that point, he had been running his own architectural firm in Maryland. And after working there for twenty years, Dr. Richards returned to academia. He was a chief facility officer for Morgan State University in Maryland, University of Alaska, Embry Riddle, as well as Tulane University in Louisi-

ana.

Twelve years ago, he retired and moved to Palm Coast and more fully embraced his choice of medium.

Of the multiple art associations found in Flagler County, Dr. Richards opted to produce pieces for the Flagler County Art League. Each piece followed the league's theme that month. He was the only artist that worked in stained glass. The league, sadly, did not recover after COVID, but Dr. Richards continued producing his pieces. Working entirely out of a small studio room at the back of his house, almost the size of a closet. It is from this humble workstation: he received the aforementioned accolades and articles written about him. One can find them in national magazines like Glass Art magazine and the Stained Glass Association of America.

He continues to take commissions, often having a few lined up. But the pieces take time. Unfortunately, he cannot make it his sole source of income. Dr. Richards works full time for Flagler County and completes his pieces during off hours and on weekends.

Each of his pieces he prices at a few hundred dollars, and is

well below their true cost, considering labor and the cost of equipment. A major factor here is job satisfaction. Dr. Richards wants his art to be more affordable so more people can enjoy it. It is this same satisfaction that keeps him working for the county. Some areas experience regular flooding; estimated 130 homes affected by the last two storms.

And through Dr. Richards's work, Flagler has gained approximately \$6 million in grant money to help our neighbors.

A more recent labor being done for his neighbors is also the biggest commission he has ever taken on. A new church is being built off the corner of Matanzas and Belle Terre, near the Dollar General on your way

to i95. This church approached Dr. Richards to produce a massive stained glass window for all parishioners to enjoy.

Dr. Richards is the idea of a professional artist. Using his engineering skills such as precision and attention to detail, his art speaks for themselves. Primarily working in landscapes and the themes Florida and never in the abstract, Dr. Richards takes great time and care into the perfection of each piece.

You can find Dr. Richards's catalogue on his website. And pay attention to any announcements coming from the Methodist Church off the corner of Mantazas and Belle Terre. See for yourself just how much of a talent Palm Coast's Dr. Richards is.




