

Flagler County Veterans Day Celebration Draws Large, Enthusiastic Crowd

It was a banner day for Flagler County veterans as residents turned out by the hundreds to celebrate their service in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Starting the morning under cloudy skies there would be no rain on the first Veteran's Day Parade in 60 years in Flagler County, as families lined up along the route to wave American flags, among them, veterans.

"Since I retired from the Army back in 2016, I've been at every Veteran's Day Parade and participated in a couple when I came back from Iraq in '04 down in Palatka. It means the world to me. I like to see a lot of people out here supporting our vets, because you know, we sacrifice so much away from our families. My daughter was born and I was in Korea at the time so I didn't get to see her born. It's just real hard on everybody that serves in the military. When people come out here and support us, it makes me feel good," shared Dwayne Dycus, who served in the US Army from 1982 to 2016.

Representatives from veteran's organizations throughout Flagler County took part in the parade, along with area businesses and both high schools' Junior ROTC programs.

Serving as Grand Marshal for the Veteran's Day Parade, U.S. Congressman Michael Waltz was proud to see the support for the region's veterans and the excellence demonstrated by the JROTC units as they marched down Moody Boulevard through the county seat of Bunnell.

"We have more people overseas right now as we speak than the entire British, Canadian, and Australian Army combined. We have a sacred duty to them that are out there now and those who have served, to take care of them," said Waltz. "It's one of the reasons I ran for Congress, was to make sure our veterans were taken care of. We're doing better but we're never doing good enough."

Waltz was candid about the role JROTC plays in forming future leaders in America.

"I'm pushing for better pay for the ROTC instructors. We got that in the last defense bill, and to expand the programs into more high schools, where our young people can learn leadership, discipline, and followership – all the things that made The Greatest Generation so great. What I love about it too is you get those positive role models, male and female veterans that are willing to serve something bigger than themselves, so I'm a huge Ju-

nior ROTC fan," added Waltz.

No parade is complete without a marching band, and with none available in Flagler County to serve, Campbell Middle School in Daytona Beach stepped up to the plate to ensure the nation's veterans were honored after being contacted by Bunnell Police Chief David Brannon.

"We do anything for veterans. Anyone who gives back to this county, one hundred percent. You need a band, we'll be the band for you," said Band and Chorus Director Bree'Shawn Watson to Chief Brannon.

Holiday Boat Parade To Grow This Year

Proudly holding its record-breaking status as the largest lighted boat parade in the State of Florida, The Palm Coast Holiday Boat Parade, sponsored by the Palm Coast Yacht Club, has announced important enhancements to the event which attracts viewers from all over the country. As always, Parade viewers are advised to seek parking early. All parking and shuttle service is free and will be available between 4 and 9 PM.

This year the Parade will begin at Cochise Waterway, the city's northern-most cut to the Intracoastal Waterway, and head south. The parade will pass the Cimarron and Club House Waterways and sail under the Hammock Dunes Toll shine," a 55-foot Viking owned by Club members Donna Heiss and Ken Mazzie.

Parade escorts include the Marine Unit of the Flagler County Sheriff's Office, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and TowBoatUS. Area Master Plan for Recreation Approved by Parks Service

The City of Palm Coast, Flagler County, and the Tourism Development Office (TDO) are excited to announce a significant milestone in the countywide Parks & Recreation Master Plan project.

The Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC), in partnership with the National Park Service, chose to review projects in Flagler County through its Rivers, Trails, and Conservation Assistance (RTCA) program, ushering in invaluable technical support to bolster its development and implementation. This initiative promises to elevate parks and recreational offerings across the Palm Coast and Flagler County.

The project took shape following a visionary collaboration between Palm Coast City Council and the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, driven by the shared goal

of enhancing and improving the county's parks and trail systems. To bring this vision to life, consultant BerryDunn was hired to support the project, embarking on an extensive community engagement effort. This comprehensive process encompassed statistically valid mailed surveys, open link surveys, focus groups, leadership interviews, and the use of an interactive social engagement website. The heart of the community's input was trail connectivity, driving dedicated discussions and becoming a central focus of the project.

In response to the community's voice during this process, the project has immediately incorporated key recommendations derived from the input of local residents:

Enhancing Trailheads: Aiming to make trail entry points more accessible and inviting.



Uniform Signage: Implementing consistent wayfinding signage across parks and trails for improved navigation.

Closing Trail Gaps and Improving Wayfinding: Ensuring that missing trail sections are completed, and navigation support is enhanced.

Shade Improvements: Identifying areas in parks and along

trails where shade structures are needed, prioritizing safety and comfort.

More news will be forthcoming as the project develops but the bottom line is that this is a great opportunity for area residents who love outdoor recreation. For more information vou can visit the National Park Service's website.

Johnathan Lord wants us to be prepared, not scared by James Moore

"Hurricane season" is a misnomer. It is a year-round occurrence that keeps the emergency responders of Florida busy, and Flagler County is no exception. Hurricane Ian in 2022 had the county's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) full of county employees activated to address the needs of its citizens. At the helm was Jonathan Lord, the Emergency Management Chief.

A recent Flagler transplant, having moved here in December 2018, Jonathan has spent a collective 20 years in Emergency Management, starting as an EMT volunteer in high school in New Jersey. He earned a degree in Emergency Medical Services and worked as a Public Health Representative for the state of New Jersey. Like every American alive that day, Jonathan's life changed on September 11 th , 2001. "Everyone was impacted and we all re-evaluated our careers and what needed to be done next," he says. He was reassigned to New Jersey's EOC and was immediately intrigued by coordinating such a varied group of disciplines from different departments.

What brought him to Florida was returning home after responding to an incident on the Jersey Turnpike. It was winter and he had to dig the county car out of the snow. Jonathan decided he wanted to live somewhere warmer. As a child, he had spent a few years living in Coral Springs and those memories brought him to Florida. Jonathan was bounced around Florida to where he was needed: Dade County, Tallahassee, Palm Beach, before accepting a job in Flagler.

Prior to the move, his experience with Flagler was limited. He had visited for meetings and conferences and found the area charming. It had reminded him of his childhood in suburban New Jersey and was an area he wanted to raise his child.

It was an immeasurable change in work tempo for Jonathan, but a welcome one. Having worked at the state level in Tallahassee, he had missed the ability to help at a local level like he can here in Flagler. And the regular emergencies he responded to in Dade County made him an expert in keeping the people of Flagler safe.

Each square foot of the EOC

facility serves a purpose for responding to a disaster, or training for the next emergency. There are no storms near Flagler they are not aware of. Jonathan's duties are to bring together the county leaders and workers and coordinate volunteers to address the needs of the community.

One example is the tornado that touched down in the B Section in October 2023. Within hours of the storm, the fire chief and other first responders were there, and Jonathan coordinated with Flagler Volunteer Services and the Parkview Church to assist and house those affected. And this is the secret for Emergency Management: multiple groups coming together to help the community. Not all of them government,

Our History: Al Krier's Historic Pilot Boat

Their histories range long through the story of mankind. Over Homer's storied wine-dark seas, in the crowded bays of Asia, on the shores of the New World, small boats hurtled out of their harbors, their mission to intercept incoming ships looming on the horizon. They were a common sight in the ancient world and for millennia thereafter until as recently as a century ago. These were pilot boats in earnest competition to bring large ships safely in and out of port.

Numbering in the thousands, ubiquitous and diverse, pilot boats measured as long as forty feet, others as short as six yards. Once serving military behemoths, giant container ships, freighters and fishing boat, they are now in retirement, replaced by larger and more sophisticated vessels. But pilots are now finding new lives as lobster and crab haulers. Others are pure pleasure boats. Still more have been transformed into colorful party boats, status symbols popularized by television icon Martha Stewart. They continue to give their all for their new captains.

One special pilot has been selected to head up the Palm Coast Holiday Boat Parade, now in its 40th year. The Parade is considered the largest boat parade in the state of Florida and attracts thousands every year to view it from the shores of the Intracoastal Waterway.

The last helmsman for this pilot was Palm Coast community stalwart Alois Michael Krier who died last year in his 86th year. Al was well known to Palm Coast not only as an activist for its citizens, but also as a weekly presence on its canals enjoying

the pleasures of his Herreshoff Pilot, its small bell ringing as Al announced his presence to the houses he passed every day, often stopping to say hello. As his daughter Roseanne Dunn says, "He never met a stranger."

Of the more than 20 boats Al owned over the years, the final boat was an 18-foot Herreshoff Pilot named "Pilot 49" because it was the 49th such boat built. Savs his son Joe. "He liked to keep things simple." Through the years he had boats named "BOAT," "187," and "LBA" which stood for 'Last Boat for Al." "We knew that wasn't true," says Joe.

He had bought the Pilot fifteen years ago, having spotted it not at dock, but under water. The boat was raised and the ruined engine was swapped for a Volvo Penta Diesel. The Pilot became Al's primary nautical transport and was a staple in the Palm Coast Holiday

Boat Parade.

When the Palm Coast Yacht Club named the 2023 Parade in Al's honor, his family decided to donate the boat to the care of its member-

in St. Augustine undergoing a restoration by All Source Marine that will give it a new mission as the first sailing emblem of the Club and a symbol of the Parade as its lead boat for as long as the Parade continues to run.

Al's 1974 Pilot is an important part of American boat-building history. The Herreshoff Manufacturing Company of Bristol, Rhode Island, was established more than 150 years ago. Among the company's clients were the Vanderbilts and Whitneys. After the company's went out of business in 1947, Nowak and Williams, also of Bristol, assumed the manufacture of Pilots



until its demise in 1980.

The vessels were built to be durable and serviceable. At first glance, the boats look clunky, scarcely the vision of a sleek millionaire's yacht. An exaggerated high prow dominates its profile. According to Mike Dolan, owner of All Source Marina, who is

restoring the boat, "It is most efficient not on the plane, that is, not skimming the surface of the water, but by charging right through it." This extends the line of the hull on the water line

offering the boat more buoyancy and greater speed and improves its performance in rough water.

Primarily distinguished by yellow or red paint, the boats were also identified by the word "Pilot" on the hull. Common navigation lights were supplemented by a round white light and below a red light. The mnemonic "white cap, red nose" was used to remember the lights' configuration as the captain's white cap and his red nose because of the copious amounts of alcohol that were supposedly consumed waiting for business.

The Herreshoff Pilots carried "un-stayed masts," the sail se-

cured only at the top and bottom of the mast. Many sailing experts agree that the freestanding sail reduces the load on the hull, thereby further increasing the boat's propulsion.

The captains did not sit to navigate. They stood. Chairs were not used because they would reduce the ability to move about the small deck and inhibited vision of the surrounding seas. Joe Krier built stools for the Pilot, but his father preferred not to use them, or, if someone else was at the wheel, to recline contentedly in the bow.

Now in the enthusiastic ownership of the Yacht Club, the boat is in all-hands mode for its restoration and maintenance, from its fiberglass hull to the top of the mast which will now be fitted with a new eight-foot sail emblazoned with the club logo. Finishing work on the teak fittings will be provided by the woman affectionately known in Palm Coast as "the Boat Girl." Jennifer Fallon is doing the work gratis.

The boat soon will be graced with a formal name. But its most important hallmark will be the bell still hanging just outside the cockpit door next to the wheel. On December 9, it will be ringing loudly as the boat leads the Parade out on to the Intracoastal Waterway, a tangible memory of Al Krier, his spirit very much alive.



Pertinent health insurance questions answered by Debra Sephton

Q: When is Open Enrollment for Health Insurance?

A: Other than Employer Group Insurance, Health Insurance for Individuals and Families started November 1st and ends December 15th if you wish your insurance to begin January 1, 2024. If you miss this deadline, you have until January 15th and your insurance will begin February 1, 2024.

Q: What are the "Essential Health Benefits" of health insurance plans?

A: As of 2014, Health insurance plans must have the "Essential Health Benefits" (EHB) to be considered qualified health plans and have Pre-existing Exclusions. The EHB's include a set of 10 healthcare categories which are, Ambulatory Patient Services, Emergency Services, Hospitalization, Maternity and Newborn Care, Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder including Behavioral Health Treatment, Rehabilitative and Habilitative Services and Devices, Laboratory Services, Preventative and Wellness Services, and Chronic Disease Management, Pediatric Services including Pediatric Oral and Vision Care.

Q: Are Preventive and Wellness Services, no charge with a qualified health plan?

A: Yes and No; there are many screening tests and procedures which do not have a charge, however if the test needs to be revisited due to a potential diagnosis, and then called a diagnostic test, usually has a charge associated with it. It also depends on where the test or procedure is performed,

Debra Sephton is a licensed agent who can help with all kinds of health insurance and she never charges her clients. You can call her at Atlantic Benfit Consultants at 386-383-3101. at the hospital as an outpatient test or procedure, or at an offsite facility.

Q: What is the difference between the insurance purchased through the Health Marketplace and what you can buy direct from a carrier?

A: Depending on your Modified Adjusted Gross Income, number of family members, age, zip code and use of nico-

tine, by using the Health Marketplace you may receive tax credits, aka subsidy, to help pay for the monthly cost of the health insurance. You will always pay full price for health insurance directly from a carrier, aka as an "off-marketplace" plan.

Q: Is there a difference in coverage between a Health Marketplace plan and an "off-marketplace" plan?

A: No, however, some carriers offer limited full price plans which are not available on the Health Marketplace.

Q: What is a Copay?

A: A Copay is a set rate you pay for doctor visits, prescriptions, and other types of care. Q: What is a Deductible?

A: A Deductible is a set amount you pay for medical services and prescriptions before your Coinsurance takes effect.

Q: What is Coinsurance?

A: Coinsurance is the percentage of the cost you pay after you have met your deductible until you reach your Max-out-of-Pocket (MooP).

Q: What Max-out-of-Pocket (MooP)?

A: Max-out-of-Pocket is a cap, or limit, on the amount of money you pay for covered healthcare services in a health

plan year. When you meet this MooP, your health insurance plan will then pay 100% of all covered healthcare costs for the remainder of the plan year.

Q: What is the age limit for your child to remain on the family health insurance plan?

A: The limit for children to remail on the family insurance plan is their 26th birthday.

Q: What is Obama Care?

place based on a calculation of the total household Modified Adjusted Gross Income and the price of the plan. This calculation is set by Health Marketplace. For additional assistance a certified broker, navigator or Marketplace agent will be able to assist you.

Q: How do I "Reconcile my Tax Credits I received from the Health Marketplace every



A: Obama Care is one of many names given to all Health Marketplace insurance plans. You may also hear the Affordable Care Act (ACA), "Marketplace," and others, but they all mean the same thing, a platform to enroll with health insurance with assistance from the government to help pay for your health insurance based on Modified Adjusted Gross Income, size of household members, age, zip code and use of nicotine.

Q: My husband's group health insurance is too expensive for me and our children, am I eligible to purchase health insurance through the Health Marketplace?

A: It may be possible for family members to obtain assistance with the Health Market-

A: Form 1095-A is a document provided by the Marketplace to individuals who enrolled in a health insurance plan through the Marketplace. It provides important information about coverage, including details of premium payments made, tax credits received, and the months of coverage. It is essential to have Form 1095-A when filing your federal income tax return, it determines eligibility for tax credits or repayment of excess credits received. If you have any questions or need further assistance regarding Form 1095-A, we recommend reaching out to a tax professional who can provide guidance tailored to your specific situation.







Michael Murphy of Evans Drive has been recognized as the December 2023 Selection of the Month by The Garden Club at Palm Coast. Originally from New Jersey, he retired and moved to Palm Coast 3 years ago. When he bought his house there was no landscaping. He initially had help from a local nursery on what to plant and today he has a very stunning curb appeal landscape.

The front door area has beautiful potted pink and red crown of thorns, a red mandevilla vine in a decorative blue pot, a Crossandra called orange marmalade, ruby red Alternanthera brasiliana, tri-color ginger (Stromanthe triostar), foxtail fern, several varieties of crotons, sago palm, ginger, rosemary, ferns, kalanchoe, Texas sage, and several bird statues throughout the flower beds.

The front island has two red crape myrtles that are underplanted with yellow allamanda, pink and yellow lantana, liriope, pentas, bird of paradise, purple irises, a border of blue daze and two whimsical pink and blue grazing birds. On the right side of driveway, there is oleander, viburnum, blue daze, orange marmalade, schefflera, and Hawaiian Ti. The back yard around the pool area is surrounded with several plants that provide color such as yellow lantana, blue daze, purple lilies, crotons, bromeliads, schefflera, podocarpus, and Hawaiian Ti, and a sago palm.

Flagler Artists

Grace Senior Morandi's colorful creations stir the emotions, by James Moore

After speaking with a plethora of artists for this magazine, I am always taken aback with the life story that is just as colorful as the art they produce. Grace Senior Morandi has lived a unique life. Originally from Barranquilla, Colombia, she was first introduced to art in Catholic school. There she learned about sketching, art, music, and theater (in both Spanish and French) from the nuns teaching her. She even won a national art contest at 13.

Despite this, art itself was not something that maintained her attention. However, her skills were used in another way. As a child, her uncle oversaw constructing floats for the annual Colombian carnivals. One day, she sat with him while he coordinated his employees and handed her a pad of paper. He asked her to sketch the float's schematics for him. This was the start of her extensive career in engineering.

She later graduated from the, then all female, University of Antioquia in Medellin, Colom-

bia with full certifications in engineering. So extensive and difficult was this career path. The program started with 400 students, but by the end, Grace was one of 2 graduates. With this, she started her expansive career back home, working for in Barranquilla city hall. As a child, her family taught her the importance of giving back to the community. Her uncle gave back with his floats. She opted to give back with her knowledge.

Work took her all over. She traveled to other parts of Colombia as a mechanical engineer. She had designed parts of shrimp boats, conveyers and mixers, potato peelers, and designed kitchen equipment.

Her work took her to the United States, from Los Angeles to Chicago and all over Florida. All that time, sketching and expanding on schematics the same way she had for her uncle, but now far more complicated.

Eventually, Grace found retirement and revisited the art she had put aside as a child.



She had explored as many techniques as she could. Watercolor, ink, charcoal, acrylic, before settling on Mixed Media.

Having spent so long as an engineer, designing devices with precise measurements requiring exactitude, Grace had worked the left side of her brain. The right side, where all the creativity can flourish, was begging for its turn to shine. It is why she prefers the more abstract look in her pieces. "I don't want this exactitude. I want to create destruction. but with harmony."

With these growing art skills, the call to give back to the community was still on her mind. "We can serve the community in many ways," she says. "To serve in profession, you do one thing. Volunteering gives more." While living in Tampa and teaching art classes to their schools,



QR Code Use Rapidly Growing in Popularity

You've undoubtedly seen QR codes all over the place in your everyday life and you maybe a regular user of them. If you are, you may not need to read this article. If you're not that familiar with them and aren't sure of what they do, then please read on.

In either case, QR codes are here to stay and are gaining in popularity and usage. We have been using them in this mag-

azine for over a year now and they have been steadily producing more and more scans each issue. In the last 90 days, for example, the number of scans made from QR codes in our pages

has gone up 174% in the last 90 days.

How do you scan a QR code? Now you can simply point most phones at a code such as the one at right and the phone will display a URL. When you touch page. When I first started using QR codes I downloaded a QR code reader from the Google Play Store. iPhone users that have an iPhone 11 or later can automatically scan codes without a QR reader. 


