### Last Year's Happenings At A Glance

#### See what happened in Palm Coast in 2023

#### **JANUARY**

The Flagler Auditorium hosted a sold-out performance from the National Ballet of Ukraine. Held on January 4th, the ballet featured Ukrainian-born performers and gave them the opportunity to display their gifts to the stage aficionados of Palm Coast. Support of Ukrainian arts and culture in America is at a high, and it's no different at the Flagler Auditorium.

A deceased orca whale washed up near Jungle Hut Beach in Palm Coast, an extreme rarity both for Palm Coast and marine biology. The whale captured public attention for days, and an examina-



tion by scientists at the Smithsonian eventually determined it died of disease, and not human interference as initially suspected.

Lehigh Trail, the three-segment walking path connecting US-1 to Colbert Lane, was announced to be receiving major renovations by the City of Palm Coast. The trailhead located at Belle Terre Pkwy and Royal Palms Pkwy was slated for paved parking, a dog park, and improved lighting among other things. As 2023 wound on, many of those improvements began to make themselves known. Much of the funding for the renovations came from

state grant money.

Mayor David Alfin publicly ruled out a run for the Florida state legislature, instead committing to running for re-election as Mayor. Alfin was elected in 2021 in a special election and has served continuously to the present, and he'll have up to two more four-year terms if he can win them. Notably, as of the writing of this magazine issue Alfin hasn't filed for his re-election campaign, but three challengers all have.

#### **FEBRUARY**

The City of Palm Coast received a grant from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) to construct improve-

ments to Waterfront Park. Long one of the most celebrated amenities in the city, the Waterfront Park walking trail and waterway was chosen to receive more convenient water access for non-motorized boats and open up the full scope of its beauty all who visit.

The annual State of the City address was delivered at the Palm Coast Community Center by Mayor David Alfin. The event marked Alfin's second time delivering his yearly update on the well-being of Palm Coast, plus a summation of positive developments that took place since



last time. Alfin's own daughter, Melanie DiMartino, performed a stunning rendition of the Star-Spangled Banner, and recently-appointed City Manager

Denise Bevan highlighted the hard work of city staff to uphold the quality of life within city limits. Awards were given to retired Fire Chief Jerry Forte, teen volunteer Emma Stanford, and activist Charles Silano.

The 8th Annual Pow Wow Festival was held at Princess Place Preserve. Long one of Palm

Coast's largest and celebrated amenities, Princess Place Preserve is home to several ultra-popular community gatherings, the Pow Wow not the least among them. Organized by Flagler County's Parks and Recreation Department in tandem with Jim Sawgrass, the Pow Wow put a variety of Native American cultural festivities on display. Attendees were treated to weapons demonstrations, wildlife exhibits, storytelling, trading booths, and more.

#### **MARCH**

The Flagler County Public Library, whose main branch is located at Belle Terre Pkwy and Palm Coast Pkwy in Palm Coast, debuted its brand new 'Food for Thought' kiosks in Bunnell. Here, citizens can exchange

food, hygiene products, and books with the honor system. In addition to presenting resources to those who may need them most, the kiosks formed a new way for community members to connect and help each other out. Two locations were opened, with both open for use

around the clock, seven days a week.

A new policy was adopted by the Palm Coast City Council to approve all questions



appearing on resident surveys before they're sent out. The idea, championed by Vice Mayor Ed Danko, was in response to a question on a survey asking residents for their gender identity. Citing modern social politics, Danko objected to the question and successfully rallied to get the City Council's eyes on any surveys before residents ever participate in them.

In grislier news, a man convicted of murder in Palm Coast was approved to receive the death penalty by Gov. Ron DeSantis. The decision by the governor to put Louis Bernard Gaskin to death was the first time it had ever happened to a Palm Coast criminal, though the city wasn't yet incorporated at the time of Gaskin's crimes. In 1989, Gaskin murdered a married couple in what is now Palm Coast's R Section by firing a .22 caliber rifle into their home while dressed as a ninja. He would receive his lethal injection in April 2023.

#### APRIL

The Palm Coast Garden Club marked ten years in the community with its centennial Spring Festival & Plant Sale. Held at Flagler Palm Coast High

mid-May. Moore, who would soon thereafter be appointed permanent superintendent, received her education at Bethune-Cookman University and worked at Rymfire Elementary School before ascending to the district office. Her promotion to superintendent was catalyzed by the firing of

Cathy Mittelstadt by the Flagler School Board at the urging of the Palm Coast-Flagler Regional Chamber of Commerce. Though the community was initially skeptical of Mittelstadt's firing, Moore has been met with overwhelming positive reception.

Hang 8 Dog Surfing became one of the largest new attractions in Flagler County, drawing



its newest German Shepherd, who was brought in to take the mantle from K-9 Keanu, who passed away in February. As Keanu's named invoked actor Keanu Reeves, the new dog was named Neo after one of Reeves' most iconic characters (from 1999's The Matrix). Neo was born in Hungary and donated to the FCSO by a local businessman.

Palm Coast City Clerk Virginia received a major promotion within the city government, being appointed Land Management Administrator. In her new post, Smith was tasked with heading up Palm Coast's expansion westward past US-1, the most significant planned development in the next few decades for the

city. "Ms. Smith is the most experienced personnel on this topic, which will allow for a smooth transition," said Communications Director Brittany Kershaw. "This amplified role

in one of the country's foremost animal sporting events. The competition was a huge hit in its second year, bringing hordes of tourism and activity to the local economy.

The City of Palm Coast and its former waste disposal partner, WastePro, had an ugly clash over the ownership of thousands of plastic recycling bins. After the Palm Coast City Council opted to end its relationship with WastePro, employees from the scorned company were sent out into

the community to collect the bins initially issued by Waste-Pro at the onset of the arrangement. The city government was irate, asserting that the bins were given to residents with no expectation of return.

#### JUNE

The Palm Coast Arts Foundation added Gustav, the 19th addition to the city's renowned Turtle Trail. A grand unveiling was scheduled for July, but PCAF wasted no time familiarizing residents with the newest turtle sculpture. Installed at Hammock Dunes, Gustav was carefully designed in light of the work of Austrian artist Gustav Klimt, his namesake. Local artist Judi Wormeck made Klimt's work come to life and prepared the turtle for his long-lasting place in Palm Coast's art culture.

The Flagler County School Board rejected a program that would've armed teachers and faculty with firearms in the event of a school shooter. The majority vote was formed by Colleen Conklin, Cheryl Massaro, and Sally Hunt, with Will Furry and Christy Chong in the minority. In the event the measure had passed, the School Board would've contracted the Flagler County Sheriff's Office to train them, pending the result of grant applications. For

now, the main line of defense against a potential gunman would be the response of FCSO school resource deputies.

Two alumni of the Palm



Coast City Council both declared their campaigns for the Flagler County Commission: Vice Mayor Ed Danko and former City Councilman Victor Barbosa. Both candidates were given their first shot at elected office in 2020, when they won the races for City Council seats 1 and 2 respectively. Danko has stayed on since then, and has now chosen to forego a re-election campaign in favor of moving up a level. Barbosa resigned in 2022 after allegations of crimes both in Costa Rica and in Palm Coast.

#### JULY

The brand new AdventHealth hospital location opened on Palm Coast Parkway, after months of construction and much anticipation. The facility brought in brand new equipment and greatly expanded Palm Coast's hospital bed capacity, with the SR-100 AdventHealth location previously being its only major option. CEO Wally Aquino, who addressed the media ahead of the hospital's opening, instantly became one of the most important business leaders in Flagler County. The influence of his direction of AdventHealth Palm Coast Parkway is felt in how healthcare is administered every day.

The return of Palm Coast's Senior Games was announced,

with a start date scheduled for September 15th. The games, which provide a fun, competitive avenue for seniors to stay active and play the sports they love, combined a variety of



events at sporting facilities all around Palm Coast. Some of the games included pickleball, golf, tennis, billiards, shuffleboard, and horseshoes. Qualifiers from Palm Coast's 2023 Senior Games were given the opportunity to compete in the State of Florida Senior Games in December.

The Flagler County Sheriff's Office buried two time capsules at their new operations center in Bunnell. Both capsules are to remain buried for over 40 years before being opened to share

their history with whoever is around to open them then. One capsule marks 100 years since the FCSO was founded in 2017, with news articles included about the anniversary from the date it was reached. The other was made to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the new operations center,

which will be reached in 2072. That one contains an eviction notice from the old location at the Government Service Building and a mask from the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **AUGUST**

Bunnell Elementary School was thrust into international

headlines when school faculty held a racially segregated assembly. The Black students in attendance were warned of early deaths or imprisonment if they didn't improve their test scores. Several employees resigned including the principal, and parents throughout

the county objected to having to explain the connotations of what occurred with their young children. Disagreements over the public relations of the event lead to the censuring of the School Board chair.

A brand new boat launch and rental station were debuted at Waterfront Park, the result of thousands of dollars in renovations to the facility. Newly debuted were a launch for small boats to navigate the waterways of the park, plus a kayak and stand-up paddleboard rental station just inside



the entrance to Waterfront Park. Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Commissioner Randy Stapleford, a champion of grant money needed for the additions, was on-hand to help usher them in.

Brian and Hailey McMillan purchased the Palm Coast Observer and Ormond Beach Observer from their previous owner, publisher John Walsh. Brian McMillan was all too familiar with the two Observer outlets, having served for years as editor-in-chief prior to leaving for months earlier in 2022.



"When I left the Observer in July 2022, I never imagined I would return," McMillan said in an email interview Tuesday evening. "But I always loved journalism and community newspapers, so I was happy when the opportunity arose."

#### **SEPTEMBER**

Hurricane Idalia impacted



Flagler County and other regions of Florida at the end of August, ultimately resulting in a best-case-scenario for Flagler. Not nearly as lucky were areas along Florida and Georgia's

border, such as Madison County. Jonathan Lord and Nealon Joseph of the Flagler County Emergency Management Department were dispatched to assist in the recovery from the disastrous Idalia impact in Madison, lending the expertise and manpower that Flagler was very close to needing itself. "We have a great team, ded-

icated to their work," said Flagler County Administrator Heidi Petito. "Flagler County was fortunately spared, and we are extremely grateful for that. Jonathan Lord and his staff were prepared to work and didn't hesitate for a moment to answer the request from Madison County."

The Flagler Tiger Bay Club announced its new lineup of leadership officers. Business leader Jay Scherr became the new President, taking over from founding President Greg Davis. Flagler Auditorium Director Amelia Fulmer became First Vice President, and attorneys Marc Dwyer and Dr. Joe Saviak each became Second Vice Presidents respectively. Meanwhile, a slate of guest speakers for the remainder of the year were also announced, including Scenic America President Mark Falzone and Florida East Coast Industries CSO Husein Cumber.

Kaiti Lenhart, the Flagler County Supervisor of Elections since 2015, announced she'd seek a third full term in office in 2024. Lenhart was appointed to the post eight years ago by then-Governor Rick Scott, and has been re-elected twice to four-year terms. "I know from experience that running for office is brutal," she said. "It's such hard work, it's very expensive, and you sacrifice time with family and friends to put your life out in a public arena."



The Flagler Playhouse, long one of the foremost artistic institutions in Flagler County, burned down in a late night blaze. The building caught fire in the early hours of October 30th and most of the structure

was entirely destroyed before firefighters could extinguish the blaze. Prior to being bought by the Playhouse owners in the 00's, the building was a Baptist church for decades.

ment was unusual in that he took over the leadership role in just his second year in office, an irregularity in Flagler County politics. Furry was backed by Christy Chong and Sally Hunt, and opposed by Massaro and Colleen Conklin.

Sims Jones, a longtime pastor and political activist, passed away at 67 following a long series of health issues. Jones ran three campaigns for the Palm Coast City Council with all three falling short, but succeeding in affecting the narrative surrounding major city issues. Jones was remembered for his compassion and leadership in the community.

#### **DECEMBER**

Flagler Sheriff Rick Staly was recognized by Bethune-Cookman University for his office's work in diversity and race relations. The honor came at the 6th Annual Florida Historically Black Colleges and Universities Law Enforcement Luncheon. "I



am honored to be among the law enforcement professionals recognized today," said Sheriff Rick Staly. "Building a strong relationship between our agency and our community has been incredibly important to me since the day I became Sheriff. This recognition is a testament to our partnership with BCU that we greatly cherish."

Senior fitness instructor Artie Gardella released his debut book, 'Because You Have a Bucket List'. In writing his book, Gardella drew from years of experience helping seniors with their strength and mobil-

ity in writing, and he now gets to present it proudly to his clients. "It encapsulates my experience in empowering seniors to live their lives to the fullest," Gardella said. "This book is more than just words; it's an invitation to embrace every moment with enthusiasm and courage, no matter

your age."

The Flagler County Sheriff's Office arrested a parolee from Georgia in Bunnell on a slew of drug and gun charges. 22-year-old Nathan tanner was convicted in a burglary some time ago, and was potentially thrown back into legal turmoil when he was arrested just last month in Flagler County. Tanner is accused of possessing several illegal narcotics as well as a firearm he was barred from owning due to his prior conviction.

## QR Code Use Rapidly Growing in Popularity

You've undoubtedly seen QR codes all over the place in your everyday life and you maybe a regular user of them. If you are, you may not need to read this article. If you're not that familiar with them and aren't sure of what they do, then please read

In either case, QR codes are here to stay and are gaining in popularity and usage. We have been using them in this mag-

azine for over a year now and they have been steadily producing more and more scans each issue. In the last 90 days, for example, the number of scans made from QR codes in our pages

has gone up 174% in the last 90

How do you scan a QR code? Now you can simply point most phones at a code such as the one at right and the phone will display a URL. When you touch that URL you are taken to a web page. When I first started using QR codes I downloaded a QR code reader from the Google Play Store. iPhone users that have an iPhone 11 or later can automatically scan codes without a QR reader. My current Samsung phone, an A13, also automatically scans QR codes so I don't have to use the QR reader software that I downloaded for free over a year ago. So if your phone doesn't scan

> automatically just download one of the free apps and you'll be all set.


