

David Alfin Delivers Final State of the City Address of First Term

Mayor David Alfin gave his annual State of the City address on February 8th, the last one he'll give in his current term in office. Along with other major civic leaders in Palm Coast and Flagler County, Alfin addressed a packed crowd in the largest room at the Palm Coast Community Center.

The evening was opened with a rousing rendition of the Star-Spangled Banner by Flagler Palm Coast High School student K'imani Gervin-McCoy. A familiar face to the community, Gervin-McCoy recently gave the same performance to open the 2024 legislative session in Tallahassee, at the recommendation of School Board Chair Will Furry and Florida House Speaker Paul Renner. Just as she did then, Gervin-McCov received thunderous applause for her singing.

Next, a host of community leaders in attendance were highlighted by Assistant City Manager Lauren Johnston. The Palm Coast State of the City is among the most important gatherings in local government, and though the mayor represents only one of Flagler County's three cities he's the most visible permanent Chair in any of the municipalities. Representatives were on hand from the County Commission, School Board, Flagler Beach City Commission, and Alfin's colleagues on the Palm Coast City Council attended as well. Also present were Sheriff Rick Staly, Elections Supervisor Kaiti Lenhart, Palm Coast City Manager Denise Bevan, and County Administrator Heidi Petito.

The tone of the address was potentially Alfin's most outward-facing speech yet. He focused almost exclusively on the accomplishments of others, namely city staff. He did devote a portion of the address toward lofty goals in the city's near future. Westward

expansion continues to loom over Palm Coast, and Alfin attempted to assure residents that the necessary steps were being taken to ensure the inevitable stresses of growth would be manageable. "Anticipating growth, we've fast-tracked an engineering study to increase the capacity of our treatment plants, aligning with our goal of a city whose infrastructure evolves responsibly by 2027," Alfin said.

Another area of local intrigue is the still mostly-unshaped Town Center area. The land surrounding the Central Landings apartments and Epic Theatres is still largely undeveloped. Alfin spoke of a multi-use facility called The Promenade to be built at the corner of Bulldog Drive and Central Ave, which would host restaurants, coffee shops, and one-to-two bedroom student housing. Tenants here would be attendees of the upcoming University of North Florida campus coming to Palm Coast.

On the issue of public safety, Alfin ceded the floor to the city's two foremost department heads: Sheriff Staly and Palm Coast Fire Chief Kyle Berryhill. Staly boasted favorable crime numbers while referencing his own time in office as a unit of measurement. Staly is running for re-election this year, with opponent Larry Jones having said he'd run but having not yet filed. Berryhill's speech was defined by a major announcement: that the PCFD would be getting a new fire station on Seminole Woods Blvd. It's been long known that this addition was in the works, but Berryhill's mention placed it back in the spotlight of upcoming city projects.

Three major citizen awards were given out toward the close of the address. The residents who were honored were as follows:

Public Service Award – David Lydon, Flagler County Veteran Services Officer

Citizen of the Year Award – Carrie Baird, Flagler Cares CEO

Next Generation Award: Erik Libby, To-Do-Dudes Founder & CEO

The close of Alfin's speech invoked the rhetoric of the presidential State of the Union addresses that these annual Palm Coast gatherings have always tonally resembled. "The story of Palm Coast is still being written, and your participation is essential to its narrative," Alfin said. "Let's continue writing this story together. Stay involved, stay informed, and let your voice be heard."

Alfin will be on the ballot for re-election in the August primary, where faces challengers Alan Lowe, Peter Johnson, Mike Norris, and Scott McDonald. If one candidate receives more than 50% of the vote, they're elected. If no one does, the top two candidates advance to a runoff on the November ballot. Alfin could serve up to two more four-year terms after this one, as his current three-year term does not count against the city's term limit policy.



Southern Recreation Center Has Grand Opening

The City of Palm Coast is thrilled to announce the grand opening of the long-awaited Southern Recreation Center and the new Lehigh Trailhead, adjacent to the current Palm Coast Tennis Center, on February 23rd from 4:30 pm to 7:00 PM at 1290 Belle Terre Parkway, Palm Coast, FL 32164. These projects are pivotal steps in aligning with the priorities outlined by the community during the recent countywide Parks and Recreation Master Plan

During the event, attendees can enjoy self-guided tours of the Southern Recreation Center and Lehigh Trailhead, giving them an up-close look at the state-of-the-art facilities and recreational spaces that promote health, wellness, and community engagement. Staff will be available to answer questions and share informa-

tion about the projects.

The Southern Recreation Center is the result of a significant investment in the community. This project was funded in part by the Flagler County Government Tourist Development Council (TDC). The facility boasts a Community Building with offices, restrooms, locker rooms with showers, kitchen dining space, public access to 2 multi-purpose rooms, lobby space, an exterior patio, and a balcony. In addition, the facility's exterior features twelve pickleball courts, six of which are covered for year-round use.

Additionally, the Southern Recreation Center project was meticulously designed to meet Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) standards. The LEED rating system, developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC), is the world's leading green building



project and performance management system that delivers a comprehensive framework for green building design, construction, operations, and performance. The incorporation of energy-efficient systems, water-saving fixtures, and environmentally friendly materials underscores the city's commitment to promoting environmentally friendly practices. As part of the project, the City is

actively pursuing LEED certification for the Southern Recreation Center.

The Lehigh Trailhead project transforms the area into a vibrant park, offering a range of amenities to cater to the diverse needs of the community. The park enhancements feature a state-of-the-art restroom building, community gardens with six ADA plots and 12 standard plots, a large and

State To Provide \$4M Grant For Library Project



The upcoming construction project of the new Flagler County Public Library branch has landed a major new cash assist – the state government will be providing \$4 million in grant funds as part of a larger funding initiative.

The selection of the library project, made by Governor Ron DeSantis, as one aspect of a \$223 million allocation largely meant to expand broadband access in Florida. \$135 million of that total is from the state's Broadband Opportunity Program, with another \$86 million coming from the federal Multipurpose Community Facilities Program.

"We are thrilled by this announcement," said County Administrator Heidi Petito. "This is huge for Flagler County. We are extremely grateful to have been awarded this money by Governor DeSantis."

The library project was chosen by the state as it will be a new source of broadband access for residents, and it will also be one of the county's most useful multi-use facilities once built. The Federal Communications Commission also selected the project in line with new rules combating the expansion of broadband in such a way that discriminates based on income level or social demographic.

Spearheading the application process for this batch of grant

money was Holly Albanese, the Chief of Special Projects for Flagler County and the Library Director. Albanese heard about the grant back in June of last year from State Librarian Amy Johnson, and worked for four months to prepare an application. "It was a very complex grant with lots of requirements," Albanese said of the process. "It is the most difficult grant application I have submitted. We revised the scope of the project from just a library to a library, a Health and Human Services Department, and a community room. It appears that was a good decision because it made us eligible for these funds. This announcement made my day. It's a big win for our community."

The first major step in the expansion process came when Albanese presented the proposal to the Board of County Commissioners. Sitting Commission Chair Andy Dance was a proponent of the idea to integrate the Health and Human Services Department and the community room, and the plan has gone forth with support from the country government ever since. The \$4 million state grant will be combined with \$9.6 million in earmarked taxpayer funds, \$1 million in revenue from library-issued passports, and \$500,000 from another state grant that was secured last year.

City Council Approves Five Year Pavement Plan

During the February 13th City Council workshop meeting, Palm Coast unveiled its strategic plan for road maintenance, following extensive collaboration with Transmap, a leading provider of support services to the transportation industry. Guided by the direction of the City Council, this comprehensive plan is tailored to prioritize critical aspects of roadway upkeep, all while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

The initiative focuses on rehabilitating major roadways through milling and resurfacing, aimed at delivering a refreshed, smooth surface. Simultaneously, crews will conduct thorough assessments to identify and address significant issues such as deep cracks or potholes. This proactive approach upholds a Pavement Condition Index (PCI) of 73 over five years. Moreover, local residential roads will benefit from global treatments, leveraging surplus funds from the primary maintenance efforts.

A roadmap has been also crafted for the next five years, outlining the scheduled resurfacing of various main roadways and residential streets. This plan will undergo annual revisions to align with actual costs, bids, and revenue updates. To consolidate projects based on market dynamics and cost projections, flexibility will be exercised, enhancing operational efficiency.

Despite an average annual revenue projection of \$3.7 million over the next five years, there remains a substantial yearly deficit of over \$4 million for pavement management, highlighting the need for careful resource allocation. To address this, the City Council approved a \$1 million piggyback contract with Hernando

County, Florida, and Asphalt Paving Systems Inc., enabling micro-surfacing on selected roadways. Additionally, the Council deferred certain items and increased fund allocations, but this won't fully sustain roadway maintenance long-term, given anticipated cost increases.

The City has created a preliminary list of twenty roads scheduled for resurfacing over the next five years. This list will be revised annually to reflect actual bids, project costs, and revenue updates. Projects may be grouped together in a single year depending on market conditions and cost estimates. The current list of roadways included in the Pavement Management Plan are as follows:





Bill May powers the local DAV office in Flagler County, by James Moore

John W. May goes by Bill. He flew helicopters during the Vietnam War and to this day is still helping his brothers and sisters in arms.

After retiring from the Army, Bill spent another decade in the civilian aviation world before moving from Wisconsin to Palm Coast in 2001. He found work with the Coast Guard out of Cecil Field in Jacksonville. Bill and his wife had been living in an RV in St. Augustine while building their house in Palm Coast. "We love it here. We're never leaving. Happy as we can be with Flagler County."

For the next twenty years, Bill worked real estate, earning a real estate and broker's associate license. All the time, unaware of, or unwilling to explore, his earned benefits as a veteran. It was a friend of his from the Flagler Sportfishing Club, who was part of the local Disabled American Veterans (DAV) chapter, that suggested Bill come in.

The DAV is an entirely volunteer based organization. In



2021, after seeing all his entitlements as a Vietnam veteran, Bill gave back through volunteering at the chapter office. Each of their positions in the office are election based, and when the commander position was available, Bill applied and won in September 2021.

Under Bill's command, the DAV is going strong. Being a 501(c)(4), social welfare, they are kept afloat through donations and volunteer hours. The DAV logged more than 1500 volunteer hours in 2023. The more hours they log, the more weight and stronger positions the DAV's national representatives can lobby Congress on veterans' behalf.

The two larger programs this DAV provides are transpor-



tation and paperwork. There are three vans the DAV coowns with the VA. Volunteers drivers are vetted; they earn a government driver's license, are up to date on all immunizations, and must have a clean driving record. They transport the county's veterans to their VA appointments.


DAV drivers have taken Flagler veterans to VA appointments (or to VA directed civilian doctors) as far as Orlando, Gainesville, and Jacksonville. In 2023, drivers transported 278 patients from their home to their appointments, and back home again. This is an average of 20-30 rides per month, on average. Veterans are invited to call into the office, which is open Mondays through Thursdays. Call even on the days they are closed, leave a message, and someone will contact you soon.

The next toughest thing veterans experience: paperwork.

And the DAV ensures you are not alone in filing for VA disability. Under Bill's command, he has accumulated 11 state certified service officers, all of whom are qualified to fill out the applications. Veterans are invited to come in, speak one on one with this officer, who will take care of the rest. No personal information is kept, in accordance with HIPAA regulations. On average, these officers work through 20 VA disability cases per month.

Every step the volunteers at the DAV take is in the service of the county's veterans. "It's rewarding, it's demanding, it's hard sometimes, but the satisfaction from helping veterans is reward enough," Bill says. Community Cats Of Palm Coast Helps The City

Local group is sole feline agency in the county, by James Moore

Spring is upon us, and that means nature will take its course. The local wildlife comes back out of the underbrush to greet us on our drive home. In some parts of Palm Coast, it's cats specifically. And as much as we would love to scoop up some of these fur babies, not everyone has the means or space to house them all. This is where Community Cats of Palm Coast comes in to do the necessary cat care.

Founded by Elizabeth Robinson, this is the only cat specific rescue organization that operates in Flagler County with the goal of reducing the homeless cat population in Flagler County.

They have since grown to become the largest foster-based cat rescue service in the county and they provide a chance for cats and kittens to live their lives as beloved pets, and humanely lowers the number of local stray and feral cats through spray/neuter and trap, neuter, and return (TNR) efforts.

These TNR efforts help the

community by stabilizing the feral population and, over time, reducing it. It ceases the territorial behavior of male strays as well as prevents female strays from going into heat. It

enables the feral, or otherwise outdoor, cats to live comfortably without being forced to add stress to the ecosystem of our neighborhoods with fresh kittens that require more than can be provided.

These are services they can provide regularly. Community Cats partner with Animal Control and the city in locating and trapping feral cats, as well as accepting surrendered pets

and caring for the sick and injured ones reported throughout the city.

These surrender pets find foster homes through the Community Cats's foster

network and have a new home found for them. As for the sick ones, no time is wasted. They receive a full vet exam and are given all required immunizations and care to address any sicknesses or infections they might have picked up while exposed to the elements.

Despite their association with the city and the county, they receive zero government funding and rely entirely on donations. All accepted donations are cash either in person or through their website as well physical items dropped off for resale in their thrift store. Readers can donate and show their support to this group by visiting their thrift store at 160 Cypress Point Parkway.



Honoring A Fabulous Flagler Female During Women's History Month

Take a hike and celebrate the legacy of Betty Steflik, one Flagler's fabulous, feisty, focused females. Let's start along the shoreline and visit some of the places she helped preserve.

Many Palm Coasters and visitors have come to enjoy a unique coquina outcropping known as "The Rocks." It became part of Washington Oaks Gardens State Park after this visionary, a Flagler Beach City Commissioner for 12 years, obtained grants to purchase 50 acres of shoreline east of A1A opposite the park's entrance. Steflik was elected in 1979 and began campaigning to protect the beach area in 1980.

Betty dedicated herself to

protecting this fragile environment for the next 25 years. In a 2004 Daytona Beach Journal Memorial tribute fellow City Commissioner Jack Kelly described her as "more than a visionary, she was a doer." In reference to "The Rocks" he stated, "She recognized that it was a very unique beach...She found the goals and she stayed with them."

Daughter Bette stated, "She saw a need, way before its time, way before any environmental measures were popular, to look at the coastlines, and realized that the dunes needed protecting." Thanks to her efforts the county secured grants to install 27 dune walkovers on the beach.



A few blocks inland from the coast you'll find the pristine salt marsh, maritime hammock and black mangroves Steflik is also credited with preserving. She initiated the purchase of 350 acres of wetlands originally known as Flagship Harbor Park. The county park is now named the Betty Steflik Memorial Preserve. The picnic pavilion is also

named in her honor.

Take a comfortable stroll along trails and raised board-walks to view wading and migratory birds thriving along with other wildlife in their natural habitat.

The preserve's entrance along South Daytona Avenue is adjacent to Wickline Park, a small recreational area next to the Wickline Senior Center.

Steflik also helped acquire the funding necessary to restore the Center, once the site of the first and only free-standing elementary school in Flagler Beach. She reportedly was one of the few people who had not given up hope of restoring the building despite its dilapidated condition.

According to Kelly, "You just couldn't turn her down...if you did she would just call you back."

Sustaining Florida's heritage and natural beauty "for our children and for our community to enjoy" was her focus. Thanks to this fabulous, feisty female current and future generations will benefit from her determination to protect and preserve the special places that help make our community so unique.







Flagler Artists

Sheryl Coon's long journey in art brought her to Palm Coast, by James Moore

Inspiration can come from anywhere. When Sheryl Coon saw photographs of her grandfather during his service in World War One, she painted it. She had taken a monochromatic approach and chose not to focus on details of her grandfather and his squad mates as a way of giving a more haunted expression for the late soldiers. This piece is "Faces of War," (right) and it gained Sheryl entry into the National Watercolor Society.

Like many artists in Flagler County, Sheryl joined the art community later in life. Originally from Fort Lauderdale, she was a Navy spouse. She and her family had traveled around the country and settled in Illinois until both sons went to college.

Sheryl attended a workshop hosted by the local art league in Morris, IL. Sketching had always fascinated her and sahe had had no formal education in art prior to this. The teacher was the then-vice president of the Transparent Watercolor Society of America (TWSA) and had welcomed Sheryl warmly. This initial positive experience would continue with the Palm Coast Art Foundation.

"They have been very generous and very helpful," she says. "Watercolor pulled me in. I don't know why, but there was something about it."

Sheryl and her husband had vacationed in Grant Haven and made the full move to Palm Coast. She kept herself active in the community; attending any workshop she could find and being active in the art society. For example, the Transparent Watercolor Society of America accepted her onto their board in 2008 as secretary and being promoted to Exhibition Chair two years later. In this position,

it was her responsibility to sort through entries for exhibition, narrowing anywhere between 600 to 1000 entries to 80.

Notably, she was president of TWSA during the Covid epidemic. Through her careful leadership, and adhering to safety requirements and procedures, she could keep her galleries and workshops going with no one in attendance reporting being sick.

These workshops hold a special place for Sheryl because it's through here she learned so much about art. She has expanded from the vintage pieces like Faces of War and gotten into abstract and nonrepresentational. Up next will be mixed media and acrylics.

This constant motion and development has granted Sheryl the opportunity to be exhibited in several organizations. Alongside the Transparent Watercolor Society of America, there is also the Florida Watercolor Society, International Watercolor Society, and National Watercolor Society.

Readers can find an example of Sheryl's work at Marineland. They have accepted the donation of a six-foot fiberglass turtle, sponsored by the Flagler



County Art Foundation, named Max.

With Sheryl painting Max, the hope was to help in bringing art education to the community. It was also a new and exciting medium for her, painting on fiberglass. The turtle is named after a fellow artist, friend, and mentor to Sheryl, named Peter Max.

With such an extensive resume in the art community, Sheryl is hoping to take the many artists with their own unique voices across Flagler and bring them all into a stronger community.

Ideally, the community can develop a relationship with the businesses in the area. Dentist's offices, banks, restaurants and other locations can all showcase different paintings on their walls for customers to peruse during their visits. All of the pieces are with the price tags on so they can be purchased then and there. No one expects to take home a painting with their teeth cleaning or opening a checking account, but it will always be a fun story to share with house guests.

It is Sheryl's hope to work on building another art community in Flagler County by hosting classes and workshops and reaching out to local artists.

As for how her own experiences have helped to shape her artistic career she said, "If there is a medium or interest you have, don't give up. Keep trying."

It also helps to have inspiration as Sheryl did so many years ago as she created the piece of artwork that helped to launch her career. inspiration and persistence have served mnany artists well and Sheryl is living proof.



QR Code Use Rapidly Growing in Popularity

You've undoubtedly seen QR codes all over the place in your everyday life and you maybe a regular user of them. If you are, you may not need to read this article. If you're not that familiar with them and aren't sure of what they do, then please read

In either case, QR codes are here to stay and are gaining in popularity and usage. We have been using them in this mag-

azine for over a year now and they have been steadily producing more and more scans each issue. In the last 90 days, for example, the number of scans made from QR codes in our pages

has gone up 174% in the last 90

How do you scan a QR code? Now you can simply point most phones at a code such as the one at right and the phone will display a URL. When you touch that URL you are taken to a web

page. When I first started using QR codes I downloaded a QR code reader from the Google Play Store, iPhone users that have an iPhone 11 or later can automatically scan codes without a QR reader. My current Samsung phone, an A13, also automatically scans QR codes so I don't have to use the QR reader software that I downloaded for free over a year ago. So if your phone doesn't scan

codes automatically just download one of the free apps and you'll be all set.

If you want to see if your phone can scan codes then try scanning the code on this page. If it works you'll be tak-

en to our web page where you can download any of our back issues. And if you have any questions for any reason just do a Google search and you'll find lots of information to help you. In the meantime, please keep reading... and scanning.


