

Deputy Sheriff Receives SAR Life Saving Medal



The Flagler County Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) awarded a Flagler County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) K-9 Deputy Sheriff with the SAR Life Saving Medal in a special ceremony at the Kim C. Hammond Justice Center February 2. FCSO K-9 Deputy First Class (DFC) Marcus Dawson was selected for his heroic actions on October 17, 2021 when he saved a three-year-old boy from a burning home.

DFC Dawson was the first to arrive on the scene of the

fire and immediately began to search the W-section residence and call out for anyone trapped inside. While putting his own life at risk, he would eventually find the child hiding under a blanket in a bedroom. DFC Dawson quickly carried him to safety.

"We are proud of law enforcement deputies like DFC Dawson and the impact the Flagler County Sheriff's Office has on our communities," said Flagler County Chapter of the SAR President Charles Hayes.

"This is the first lifesaving SAR medal awarded in Flagler County."

The SAR Life Saving Medal is presented to those individuals who have acted to save a human life without necessarily placing their own life, or them-

selves, in permanent danger. Flagler County Sheriff Rick Staly and FCSO staff were on hand for the presentation.

"DFC Dawson made a difference in the lives of that young child, his family and the community," Sheriff Staly said.

Taking down trees since his teenage years

He "felled" his first tree at age 14.

Note, he "felled" the tree. He did not fall from out of the tree. Rather, Matt Klinkenborg climbed to the top with a chainsaw and "cut" his way down what was a 75-foot tall tree in four-foot sections.

Klinkenborg said he started his business two weeks later encouraged by the confidence he gained in the successful taking down of that pine tree.

"I just fell in love with this work," he said. Pardon the pun.

The term "fell" as applied to a tree is one used by arborer's, landscape managers and timber professionals in reference to the process of knocking down or taking out a tree.

It rolls off Klinkenborg's tongue with authority as he, the owner of Paradise Grove Landscape Tree and Property Management of Palm Coast, talks confidently about his work ascending the area's oaks, palms and pines that have gotten too big for their current location.

He admits that he somewhat enjoys taking a few moments to look around once he gets to the top of a customer's tree that is soon to become lumber and or sawdust.

"Sometimes, I just look around for a bit. Depending on the height of the tree, I can be as much as 130 feet in the air," Klinkenborg said, noting that unlike many other people, he obviously isn't scared to climb to that height. He's been climbing up trees ever since he can remember and much more

before he started bringing cutting equipment along for the journey. "It's pretty cool to be able to see a lot of the area of Palm Coast and Flagler County from that high. I like to take a moment and enjoy one of the highest points in the area."

Klinkenborg finds other satisfaction in his work.

With 17 years of experience in the landscape management business, he still likes being able to help his clients eliminate worries they may have about their property.

When asked what he finds most rewarding about his work, Klinkenborg said, "Honestly, it is that I get to change somebody's landscape and make them be able to relax and not have to stress about their property. Some of these trees can weight up to 20 tons. During hurricane season, that's a lot of weight to potentially hit someone's house and cause millions of dollars in damage or potential death."

From removing trees that have suffered wind damage and threaten to fall on a house or a shed or a child's play equipment to other vegetation that has outgrown its space, Klinkenborg said his work helps him carry on the generations-long legacy of investing in Flagler County that his family

Both sides of his family have deep roots here dating back at least 150 years to the mid-1850s. His maternal great-grandmother was part

ing back at least 150 years to the mid-1850s. His maternal great-grandmother was part of one of the first pioneer families to settle in Bunnell. His great-grandfather was a train operator when the Lehigh Railroad was first established in Flagler County. His family had many farmers in it, but also architects, bankers, and a sheriff. He loves that when he drives by the water plant on US Highway 1, he sees his grandfather's name on it. With an appropriate joy, he makes mention of the scholarships given annually in his grandfather's name that help area students pursue higher education and vocational training.

"I take a lot of pride in my work, not just because of my own work ethic," Klinkenborg said. "But because I can take pride in being able to bring value through my work to this slice of paradise that my family helped build."



Hammock Thrift Store Supports Local Charities

You never know what you might find in a thrift shop.

That's the motto of the Hammock Thrift Shop located at 5404 N. Oceanshore Bouvelard in Palm Coast.

"As always, keep on 'Thrifting,' you never know what treasure you might find," was included as a call to action in a recent post on the store's Facebook page.

Indeed, such is true as the store's current inventory as of this writing included more than 150 pieces of sterling silver jewelry secured from auctions and estate sales. Unique rings, necklaces, brooches, and earrings were listed as being offered at "very reasonable prices."

Shop owner Nancy Swinderman opened the store on Au-

gust 1, 2015, with the goal of turning her own thrift shopping experiences into an opportunity for others all the while helping support other local charities.

"I was retired and I wanted to give back to the community," Swinderman told Palm Coast Magazine.

Currently, proceeds from the Hammock Thrift Shop support the work of the Flagler County Free Clinic and the Disabled American Veterans Chapter 86 in Palm Coast.

A "spare change" jar stationed at the store's checkout counter collected more than \$1,100 last year for the Hammock community food pantry, Swinderman said.

The shop employs seven people – Swinderman included as well as her daughter who is the





shop's manager - part-time.

Each day the shop is open, various items are chosen to be added to the shop's "free" rack. The bulk is clothing – particularly items that have a small stain but are still in good shape for wear doing "dirty" jobs such as gardening, Swinderman said.

Donations are accepted anytime during the shop's open hours. Those hours are Monday through Saturday from 10 AM to 4 PM.

Swinderman said the shop

does not accept children's clothing, toys, electronics or ceiling lights or fan fixtures. But the shop just recently purchased a cargo van to facilitate free pickup of furniture from those donating and to rent for a nominal fee for those purchasing furniture and needing transportation assistance.

The shop is easy to find, Swinderman said. "Our landmark is that we are located directly across from Publix on A1A," she said. — *Amy Armstrong*

Rosewood The Subject Of Latest Historical Society Presentation



Nearly 100 years ago the town of Rosewood, Florida near present day Cedar Key was destroyed during a racially motivated attack. For sixty years the incident was rarely discussed until St. Petersburg Times reporter Gary Moore uncovered rumors of mob violence in the rural community while researching a travel story in 1982.

Details of the horrific incident and the context during which it occurred were shared by Dr. Vincent Adejumo, professor of African-American Studies at the University of Florida, at a Florida Humanities Speaker Event hosted by the Palm Coast Historical Society on February 19. "History can sometimes make us uncomfortable," noted PCHS President Dr. Elaine Studnicki," but it must be shared."

This article was written by Kathy M. Reichard-Ellavsky, the Palm Coast Historical Society Vice-President. Included in the presentation was an excerpt from a "60 Minutes" segment hosted by journalist Ed Bradley in 1983. His report included interviews with survivors of the attack which had largely remained a secret for decades.

Minnie Lee Langley was 8 years old at the time of the massacre and recalled running into the woods in the middle of the night when she heard shots being fired and smelled homes being burned.

The incident began when Fanny Taylor, a white woman living in the neighboring town of Sumner, claimed she had been raped by a black man. A mob of nearly 1500 white men believed to have ties to the Ku Klux Klan descended on the 200 residents of the predominantly black town of Rosewood in search of the suspect.

Official accounts state that during the rampage at least eight people were killed, two white and six black, although the survivors believe that well over 150 people were murdered and buried in mass graves.

Every building in town was burned with the exception of the home of John Wright, a white store owner. He sheltered several black residents and contacted the railroad for help, exclaiming, "The town is on fire." Days later the train made a special stop near the depot to evacuate the survivors. They never returned.

When news of the massacre started to resurface, the survivors demanded restitution as well as an investigation into the matter. Property owners had never been compensated for their losses. In addition, an all-white Grand Jury in 1923 had found no evidence of a crime despite the incident having been widely covered by local newspapers at the time.

In 1994, following a contentious and politicized debate, Governor Lawton Chiles signed a bill awarding two million dollars to the survivors to cover property damage and to establish a scholarship fund for the descendants.

Professor Adejumo fielded questions following the lecture. They ranged from inquiries on the status of preservation efforts to save the Wright house to clarification on the definition of critical race theory

which has been widely reported in the media. Dr. Adejumo noted that while CRT is taught in law school it is not part of the public school curriculum or even in most university level history courses.

Comments from the audience included the need to increase educational opportunities in the community outside of traditional classrooms for both children and adults to better understand our shared history. That is the purpose behind the PCHS Speaker Series as well as programs offered by the African American Cultural Society, the University Women/Flagler, and others.

The Palm Coast Historical Society's next Speaker Event features Dr. Andrew Frank from Florida State University. His lecture is entitled "Making Chief Osceola" and will be presented on Saturday, March 19 at 10 AM at the Palm Coast Community Center

"Museum Monday" is a new PCHS series concentrating on local Palm Coast history. The upcoming event features former ITT employee and Exit Realty Broker Ric Giumenta on Monday, March 14 at 4 PM at the PC Historical Society Museum in Holland Park.

Dr. Joshua Wright, chiropractor, talks about fasciitis problems

Walking, stair climbing, jogging and even relaxing at the end of the day can all bring about the stifling experience of plantar fasciitis. Since your feet are essentially where the rubber meets the road, the place where all of the complex biomechanics of the movements between the spine, the pelvis, and legs meet the hardened ground on which we walk, debilitating pain in this area can be life changing.

The foot has a built in suspension mechanism that transfers the pressure generated from each step taken through the ankle to the knee and beyond. If the foot is no longer able to transfer, i.e relay pressure, then more responsibility is placed on the ankle and knee, and eventually the hip and lower back if no therapeutic action is taken to restore normal function of the limb.



Fifth Element's Indian Food **Hits Close To The Mark**

After having lived in Bangkok for 20 years and experiencing Indian food at many restaurants in the area of the

city where we lived (23 were within walking distance) we became somewhat familiar with the many flavors of Indian cuisine. Also, reviewing many Indian restaurants over the years there allowed us to meet and talk with many owners and chefs so our education was furthered even more.

So we looked forward to visiting what appears to be the only real Indian restaurant in the

immediate area. Afterwards, we were a bit disappointed in some aspects of the restaurant

but other things were more encouraging.

One of the biggest challenges in cooking Indian food is




finding the correct ingredients because they may not always be available and having the right ones is critical to the taste of the dish. Substitutes can be used but it's difficult to reproduce the right flavors without the exact ingredients needed. Also important is the order theat the ingredients are added to a dish so the chefs must also be on the ball.

And it's actually the flavors they produce here that we thought were done well. Instead it was the cooking processs that really created the problems here.

Some of the best Indian food we've ever had came from the tandoor, an upright cylindrical oven that is used to cook a wide variety of ingredients. When used properly the tandoor can create some incredible flavors and textures using ingredients as diverse as lamb or shrimp. If,

however, any ingredient is left in the oven for too long, and that could mean mere seconds in some cases, then the food is overcooked and dry. This was the case at Fifth Element.

Fortunately, for the restaurant, it's a minor fix — just take the food out of the oven a minute earlier and you're fine.

Inexperience in the kitchen may be a factor here and we're quite willing to give them a bit of a pass here since there probably isn't a restaurant in the county that isn't suffering from some sort of staff shortage. It's still not right but at least there's a simple solution.

And the same goes for the only other problem we encountered here and that's lackadaisacal service. This is probably a function of the fact hat we could not see anv management people here, the same as it is in most places nowadavs.

It's not only a lack of servers that impacts service, it's also a lack

of supervisory or management staff that causes problems with service. This is almost certainly a cost-cutting measure but unfor-

> tunately it impacts service in a negative way.

> The service here wasn't terrible, it just wasn't as attemtive as it could have been. It was also easy to see that the servers had never been trained well right from the beginning and that's



the fault of management.

Anyway, the flavors here are good and are very comparable to what we used to eat in Bangkok, and the prices are definitely reasonable based on portion size and quality so don't stay away from here because of our minor criticisms. Based on our experience with Indian food, both here and in Asia, Fifth Element is worth your time and money.

French Feminism to the history of doo-wop

The City Repertory Theatre gives a nod of sorts to National Women's History Month with a French twist as its presents, "The Revolutionists" for its March production.

It is a recently written play by American playwright Lauren Gunderson having its debut in 2017. Gunderson is the author of 20-plus plays and musicals and in 2017 and 2019 she was the most produced playwright in the United States.

This two-act play with a running time of 100 minutes follows the lives of four women living in France during the French Revolution's Reign of Terror in 1793 and 1794. Olympe wants her life to be revolutionary, but she isn't interested in the actual revolution. She's an armchair revolutionist who does not want to get bloody or messy. Marianne is a working mom torn between her worry for the safety of her husband and children and her attempts to help bring justice to France. When her husband dies, she relies on his love and her belief in feminism to stay strong and keep the fight against slavery in France going. Marie (yes,



the infamous Marie Antoinette who said, "let them eat cake," when told that the poor of the nation had no bread) is seen differently in this play than as most history books present her. She still acts as if politics does not impact her, but audiences will also see her womanhood as she grieves with Marianne as a fellow widow. She demonstrates a full-scale mama bear persona as her children are attacked. Charlotte is a young woman unfettered by children or family as she pursues her work in social reform. She rages at injustice and knows death

is coming for her. She faces her death as a true martyr.

The play explores feminism in France during the Reign of Terror and how flawed, imperfect women struggled to effect changes in their society. Some reviewers have labelled the play's characters as, "funny as hell," also noting, "that is one of the things that is most brave and badass: humor."

Yes, scaffolding — hanging as was done in the Reign of Terror — is involved in this play. Might not be the best choice for young viewers.

But for adults, this play also alludes to the status of nations today: Wars, excessive debt, citizens who are overtaxed and overworked, low approval and trust of government, corruption in leadership and the increased presence of racism, sexism, poverty, violence and extremism. It leaves audiences to answer this question for themselves: How much are today alike to those who lived

Flagler Artists

Beeswax On Wood is Vevera's latest artistic endeavor

The world would be "awfully dull" without art.

So believes Trish Vevera, a Palm Coast artist with years of experience creating colorful and enlivening scenes on canvas and now, wood formats.

"I mean, one can eat and sleep and live in a house without art, but if you don't have some kind of art — something else to stir your soul — then life is not worth living," she told Palm Coast Magazine. "Unfortunately, a lot of people just eek out an existence. The fortunate enough ones do some type of art."

Thus, Vevera's version of art as an enrichment to life is scheduled for display from March 6 through April 6 in the gallery at Grand Living Realty. Formerly named "The Grand Gallery," the space donated by the realty agency has a new name as of March: Reflecting the addition of a team to help Jan Jackson curate the works on display there, the gallery is now titled, "Expressions Art Gallery on Colbert at Grand Living Realty." Vevera's is one of the artists featured in this dual show: The pastel work of Karen Ann Patton is the other. (Watch for a feature on Patton in the April edition of Palm

Coast Magazine.)

Vevera's latest art passion is the use of cold beeswax mixed with oils. Its application to the chosen surface creates a much softer, somewhat foggy and misty appearance.





She started using beeswax during the pandemic. She wanted to try something new and quickly discovered a fulfilling way to pass the time during the lockdown.

"With beeswax, the paint goes on very smoothly and it works well for layering," Vevera said. "You can scratch through the paint and let it dry and then layer it some more and scratch again. It creates a lot of texture."

Vevera switched up from using brushes to apply acrylic paints to now using a palette knife to apply the beeswax mixed paints. She found that credit cards – expired ones, she notes – are useful for scraping through the paint to credit unique lines and edges.

"It is a little different way of painting, but also so fun to see what happens," she said.

Vevera attributes her artistic bent to her mother - a consistent crafter. Her mother was a hatmaker continually working

with feathers and felt as well as needle work projects. In grade school, Vevera was the "bulletin board person," and she participated in a poster contest featuring poppies for Memorial Day. She recalled how the business owners of her hometown in Illinois would display the entries in their respective stores.

"In school, art for me was something I had to work hard at. So, I stuck with it," she said. "It was more of a challenge for me. I worked at it and kept working at it. I guess I am still working at it."

That is a humble statement coming from a woman whose work is included in several area galleries, throughout the United States and Canada as well as in the Czech Republic, Germany, Norway, Spain and Sweden. Vevera has received numerous awards from art groups including being named the 2018 Flagler County Artist of the Year by the Gargiulo Arts Foundation. — Amy Armstrong




