






Death of Education Advocate Leaves Gaping Hole in Flagler County

Joseph Rizzo, executive director of the Flagler County Education Foundation, died unexpectedly on March 6, 2022.

He was 47 years old.

Rizzo was the driving force behind a massive expansion of the foundation's services for disadvantaged Flagler County students. In his five years at the helm of the foundation, Rizzo's efforts more than tripled the foundation's assets and doubled the number of students served, according to an announcement posted on the foundation's website.

"Joe's legacy has a far-reaching impact," Trevor Tucker, current school board chairman, told News-DaytonaBeach.com. "If there was an opportunity to support a program in Flagler Schools over the past two decades, Joe Rizzo had a hand in it. His work with Carla Cline in creating the Josh Crews Writing Project has given so many of our students a voice. Joe and the team he built within the Flagler County

Education Foundation became a vital role in the success of our district."

More than 1,000 Flagler County students have been published via the aforementioned writing project. The project was named for Josh Crews, an FPCH graduate who died at age 34 in November 2010 in a single-vehicle wreck. Crews, like so many others in Palm Coast, was a friend of Rizzo. Crews worked as a bartender in a restaurant owned by Rizzo and was well-known for his love of the English language, literature, and writing.

Rizzo was a Flagler County native, having graduated from Flagler-Palm Coast High School in 1994. He graduated from Mars Hill University near Asheville, North Carolina, at which he played football and met his wife, Teresa. Rizzo returned to the Palm Coast area in 1999. He became involved in several business ventures including Woody's Bar-B-Q on SR-100 in Palm Coast, the Island Grille in

Flagler Beach and the Bull Creek Fish Camp at Dead Lake. Rizzo's



passion for improving education was fueled by his appointment to the Flagler County Education Board of Directors from April 2005 through June 2010.

Rizzo was featured on the cover of the second edition of Palm Coast magazine in September 2021. The feature story regarding the work of the education founda-

tion revealed the depth of Rizzo's commitment to improving education in Flagler County. He clearly communicated the joy doing so brought to his life.

We at Palm Coast magazine are saddened to be writing a second obituary in the April 2022 edition. The subject of the first is Tom Gargiulo, the "father" of arts in Palm Coast. In a short period of time, the Palm Coast area has lost two prominent citizens whose absence is being felt as a big black hole in its social fabric.

Our sincere condolences to both families as we consider ourselves blessed to have interviewed both men. Rizzo is survived by his wife Teresa, two children son Joseph and daughter Caroline, and sister Krista.

In lieu of flowers, Rizzo's family requests donations be made to the Flagler County Education Foundation to honor his passion for its mission.

"Father" of art leaves legacy all over Palm Coast

The sudden death of Tom Gargiulo in mid-February 2022 has left the local art community stunned and without its long-time, dedicated leader and perhaps most vocal cheerleader constantly encouraging artists to create and display.

Gargiulo died of a heart attack on Feb. 13. He was 83.

"He helped a lot of local artists," said Trish Vevera. She was the 2018 recipient of the Flagler County Artist of the Year Award from the Gargiulo Foundation started by Tom and his longtime partner, Arlene Volpe. "He was a great guy."

It would be a challenge to spend even just a brief period of time in the City of Palm Coast and not see a piece of art that he either created or facilitated the creation of by financially supporting



the artist that created it.

Examples include sculpted birds at Waterfront Park, a burro in the Town Center, the panther near the Hammock Dunes Bridge and paintings inside the Flagler County Public Library and the windsails sculpture located outside of it.

Go beyond Palm Coast itself and Garguilo's art footprint is evident in other parts of Flagler and Volusia Counties. He made numerous donations to the art collection at Daytona State College in Daytona Beach: Close to equal amounts of art pieces that he created, and art pieces created by area artists that were purchased by the foundation and donated to the school.

Palm Coast Magazine had the opportunity to speak with him several times since our beginning in August 2021. He was more

than willing to tell us his story of art in Palm Coast. Those conversations involved him only in that he was busy promoting the work of others. What he wanted to talk about where the accomplishments of the artist the foundation supported.

"There was nothing here when Arlene and I first moved here. It was a blank canvas," he said. "We knew that had to change and so we worked hard to help other artists pursue their dreams."

Thus, shortly after moving to Palm Coast in 1994, he and Volpe started the foundation. Six years later in 2000, they began selecting an artist of the year. They have done so each year since including the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic when announcement of the year 2000 selection was delayed, but still occurred.

He was born in Bridgeport, Connecticut in 1938. He told Palm Coast Magazine he was always interested in art, earning a bachelor's degree and then his

master's in fine art education. He taught middle and high school art for years, all the while working on his own creations.

He began his art career in oils but later transitioned to printmaking because of the flexibility it offered him.

Gargiulo presented in many solo art shows throughout the New England states, New York City, Florida and in Europe.

When asked last summer just how many shows he has been in, his answer was a humble, "Probably too many to count. But that doesn't matter."

Beyond buying the work of other artists, Gargiulo took a handson approach to developing the local art scene. He led workshops including bringing printmaking to the Flagler County Art League. He encouraged thinking beyond the canvas by showing workshop attendees how to use materials outside of the regular art spectrum to create.

He and Volpe regularly invited fellow artists and well, anyone

with an interest in art, to their home.

Jan Jackson, the curator of the art gallery at Grand Realty in Palm Coast and winner of the 2020 artist award, qualified on both fronts. She said her jaw must have dropped wide open the first time she visited.

"I really didn't know the extent of his devotion to his cause (art) and his support of artists until I visited his home. Art, art, art from floor to ceiling. Not an open space anywhere," Jackson told Palm Coast Magazine. "Art filled the closets and the corners, and I'll bet under all the beds."

Jackson said she saw what those who knew Gargiulo well remember most about him.

"He actively supported and promoted local artists and had a close connection with several of those artists for many years," she said.

As of press time, arrangements for a celebration of life have not been announced.



Flagler Cares Promotes Health, Social Welfare

When someone is down on their luck and must turn to a charitable organization for help, the process can be overwhelming. Just the pages and pages of paperwork can be enough to deter an applicant. Add to that the fact that there are so many different groups with the mission to help. Yet, which one is the correct one to handle specific concerns such as:

- Food assistance
- Emergency utility or rent payments
- · Clothing for children
- Where to get help with substance abuse when you have no insurance
- Help filing a tax return

Early Maps The Subject Of Latest Historical Society Speaker Series

Those who think history is boring have likely not heard a lecture presented by Dr. Roger Smith of Colonial Research Associates, Inc. According to Smith, "If I haven't made you laugh, then I probably haven't taught you anything."

Laughter filled the room during the latest Florida Humanities Speaker Event hosted by the Palm Coast Historical Society on March 19 at the Palm Coast Community Center. The presentation entitled "I AM SO LOST" included details from over a decade of Smith's academic research using old maps originally housed in the British

His research uncovered early renderings drawn by 16th century explorers led by Juan Ponce DeLeon in search of riches in the New World. A map from 1589 was the first to show the City of St. Augustine. It included primitive drawings indicating the location of a lighthouse, the location of a murder, and sea serpents. Another illustration depicted the Florida terrain with its swamps and bogs. Eighteenth century British military maps showed troop movements in East and West Florida during the Revolutionary War. He identified these two regions as the 14th and 15th British colonies.



Smith recalled the story of having met his wife, Christina, at a free history lecture he provided at the St. Augustine Lighthouse and Museum. When he tried to explain to the visitors that there were origi-

nally 15 British colonies within the borders of what is now the continental United States she attempted to correct him. A native of Boston. Christina. like many of us, were taught that there were only "13 original colonies" when the American Revolution broke out. His first reaction was, "I can't believe I'm being heckled at a free talk!" But she caught

his eye, and as the saying goes, the rest is history.

The original basis for much of the war was Britain's desire to protect the sugar-producing colonies of the West In-



dies from French, Spanish, and Dutch invasion. "Sugar was the economic driver in the 17th and 18th centuries," explained Smith. The production of sugar and the system of slave labor that produced it were extremely profitable. European empires became dependent on its by-products of rum and molasses to finance their visions of global expansion. For this reason many Caribbean islands were deforested to plant sugar.

With so much soil dedicated to sugar production the British planters relied on the southern colonies in North America for food, flax, cotton, pine tar, turpentine, timber, and more. They became the agricultural heart of the empire. General George Washington wrote a letter to John Hancock in 1775 warning the Continental Congress that the British were stockpiling weapons and gunpowder in St. Augustine. He feared that the British were preparing to reclaim the southern colonies by invading Georgia and South Carolina with an army from East Florida. Historic maps later revealed that Washington was correct.

Smith shared another revelation regarding an incident in St. Augustine on August 11, 1776. Prior to the war Florida was economically depressed. However, once loyalists fleeing the north began to settle in the region they helped bring economic prosperity. For this reason both East and West Florida remained loyal to King George III. When news of the Declaration of Independence finally reached the old city an an-

gry crowd gathered in the plaza and hung effigies of Samuel Adams and John Hancock and set them on fire.



insulting our audiences by dumbing it down or withholding valuable new information," says Smith. "The role played by British St. Augustine in the American War of Independence is Florida's most unique story in its 500-year history — perhaps the most unique story of the American Revolution."

Can massage therapy help you?

You might think that massage therapy is a modern trend that natural healing practitioners are pushing. That's partially true. The medical benefits of massage therapy are certainly being touted these days, but it's not new. Massage therapy is part of a traditional holistic system of healing methods that began about 5,000 years ago.

The history of massage therapy dates back to 3000 BCE (or earlier) in India, where it was considered a sacred system of natural healing. Used by Hindus in Ayurveda "life health" medicine, massage therapy was a practice passed down through generations to heal injuries, relieve pain, and prevent and cure illnesses. Promoters of Avurveda believe that illness and disease are caused when people are out of sync with the environment. Massage is believed to restore the body's natural and physical balance so that it can heal naturally.

Fast forward hundreds of years to the early 1800s when Swedish doctor/gymnast/teacher Per Henrik Ling created a method that became known as the Swedish Movement Cure to help relieve chronic pain. As much medical gymnastics as massage therapy, it was the precursor to what we now know as Swedish massage — a style that involves stroking, pressing, squeezing and striking.

Whereas Ling's method used massage in his movements, 19th-Century Dutchman Johan

Massage therapists Sophia Mascarella and Christine Brinker can be reached at 386-864-2686 and 386-503-4300 respectively for more information and appointments. George Mezger is credited with incorporating techniques that are used today:

- Effleurage, which uses long, gliding strokes from the extremities inward at various levels of pressure.
- Petrissage, a technique that is rhythmic and may include

of a space in the West Point office complex on Palm Coast Parkway.

Both women practice massage but both have their individual preferences when it comes to exactly how they treat their clients based on their years of experience



kneading, skin rolling, lifting or a push-pull movement.

- Tapemotement, a beating/ tapping administered with the side of the hand, a cupped hand or fingertips used in Swedish massage.
- Friction, a technique that is physically demanding, consisting of deep, circular or crosswise movements with the thumbs, fingertips, palms or elbows, designed to penetrate deep tissue.

Fast forward again to today and you can see where massage has taken us. There are literally dozens of different massage disciplines from various cultures around the world although most have been derived from the essential basics of Swedish massage.

Here in Palm Coast there are a number of practitioners of the art of massage and we recently visited with two of them, Sophia Mascarella and Christine Brinker, who work out

(they've both been involved with massage for many years) and the clients' needs.

Christine, for example, does more in the way of muscle balancing which is designed to counteract harmful muscle imbalances that result in poor body posture. With the repetitiveness of occupation and daily activities, pain occurs due to imbalances created by overuse of certain muscles and under use of others.

Sophia, on the other hand, characterizes herself as someone who works more with deep-tissue techniques. Both work with clients that have ongoing issues and Sophia also specializes in helping people recover from accidents and other physical ailments.

One thing that both stress when working with clients is the need for good communication between them and their clients. Always maintaining a comfort level for the client in terms of how much force is used is one of the issues that is always important. And getting feedback from the client before every session helps the therapist to assess the progress that is being made in the case of a rehabilitation effort or the increase in overall well-being resulting from continuous treatments.



We never got a chance to try real barbecue until we moved to Palm Coast a year ago. One of the first restaurants we tried




during our first days here was Sonny's Barbecue. The pictures

Waiting For Godot, Proof, Bobby Darin, One Night In Memphis

You'll have to wait until the end of April for this month's presentation by the City Repertory Theatre in Palm Coast. But it should be worth it considering the play's title: "Waiting for Godot."

Okay, pardon the silly theatrical pun. If you want to laugh and cry at the same time, this play is for you.

formance on Dec. 4, 1956, at the Sun Studios in Memphis, Tennessee, when Johnny Cash, Elvis Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis and Carl Perkins took the stage together. The outcome of that night remains a legend in music history as 1950s rock and roll combined with country, gospel and rockabilly for an impromptu jam session no one expected. Flagler Artists

Local marsh settings are Inspiration for pastel artist

As a painter, Karen Ann Patton is drawn to the local marshes.

"The marshes are like old Florida used to be," she said. "I love the old trees in the marshes and the grasses. The sky behind it is just so beautiful. That is what I really love."

She is a major fan of morning and evening equally at a local marsh because of the variation in the skies associated with each time of day.

"Each gives a whole different palette to work with as far as the colors are concerned," Patton said. "The skies in Florida are just so beautiful with all the shades of orange, purple and green."

Her work is on display through April 6 at the Expressions Art Gallery on Colbert at Grand Living Realty formerly known as The Grand Gallery. Patton's display features a variety of acrylic, oil and pastel paintings. Her work has been on display since March 6 in a



joint show with Trish Vevera.

Patton's passion is being able to paint outdoors. Now in her mid-80s, accomplishing that isn't quite as easy, she admits.

"There are just so many places around here that are just so beautiful to paint," Patton said with a bit of chagrin in her voice as she continued. "But now I am more of a studio painter. Painting outdoors involves a lot of work dragging all of your equipment out there while wishing for good weather and hoping that it does not start to rain and you have to pack up and leave."

As a child, Patton was always interested in painting. But she didn't get serious about pursuing her passion until her mid-30s when her own children were older and she was able to take lessons and attend workshops.

Having lived most of her life in New York City, Patton was able to study under many of the top painters there includ-



ing Wolf Khan – a German born American artist whose combination of realism and color field work brought artistic advances in pastel and oil painting as well as printmaking.

"I really enjoyed that," she said of the workshops she did with Kahn.

She learned much about the use of pastels, which is her most preferred medium.

"Pastels are just so much softer and calming," she said.

Patton is delighted that one of her larger pastels of a local marsh remains on display in a cancer center waiting room at an Ormond hospital.

"People have told me that they looked at the painting while waiting for their appointment and that they felt much calmer about their treatment," she said. "That makes me feel good to hear that it helps others."

Her work is on display in several other hospitals — one in Jacksonville and a few in New York City.

A breast cancer survivor herself, Patton's art is also on display in the art collection of pharmaceutical giant, Eli Lilly and Company located in Indianapolis, Indiana. One of her pastel paintings won top prize in the company's 2010 competition.

Her work has been on the cover of many Flagler and Volusia-based magazines as well as the cover of Sun and Surf Magazine. She's also been in multi-artist shows and solo shows.

Having moved to Plantation Bay in Palm Coast in 2002, she quickly surmised many of her neighbors were also artists. Thus, a few years later, she organized an annual show for which Plantation Bay residency was a requirement to display, but the public could attend to purchase and view.

"Thirteen years later, that show is still going strong," she said. "I like that."




